It wouldn't take much, I've been working in Tairawhiti so I know how easy this happens, it wouldn't take much for water to reach the level that it would flood houses around here and there are more houses, so it is really important that we get these people engaged. I would image its probably just apathy more than anything and not understanding the gravity of the situation. So, I'm quite happy to volunteer to do that if it's okay to share people's private information or whether I write a letter and you forward it onto them as a resident, whatever way we can do this. Maybe get some coverage in the local paper not that everyone reads the paper, put it on the Greytown social media pages, just find different ways of getting people's attention
