RLT21 **Public Participation**

Mr Brent Efford, Transport 2000

Mr Efford criticised the subsidy level to car users implied in the Transmission Gully Willingness to Pay Survey and said that it represented a massive commitment of regional resources to private car commuting at a time when the public transport infrastructure was receiving minimal investment. New traffic encouraged by a low toll would be massive.

Mr Efford said the advantages of the road have been oversold and safety earthquake, environmental and economic efficiency drawbacks have not been discussed. Mr Efford also criticised the objectivity of the survey and said the enthusiasm of the Regional Council for Transmission Gully presents a u-turn for the Council.

Mr Efford concluded that the best approach is not to be build the road and concentrate a lesser amount of money on improvements to the existing highway and boosting the rail corridor.

A copy of Mr Efford's submission was circulated to members.

Mr Barry Cook, Ratepayer

Mr Cook said that as one person he did not wish to hold up progress and that he lived in Plimmerton by choice. Mr Cook said he had been a member of the Automobile Association for 50 years and had driven a car for that period of time. Mr Cook said he had also been a cyclist for 30 years and was also a keen member of a walking group. Cyclists and walkers were intimidated by trucks hurtling through Plimmerton on a regular basis and Mr Cook made a plea for provision to be made as soon as possible for walkers and cyclists in the area. Mr Cook said that the Transmission Gully road would be of inestimable value for residents and requested that the project be progressed as quickly as possible.

Mr J C Horne, 28 Kaihuia Street, Northland

Mr Horne said that the Transmission Gully community survey was designed to elicit responses supporting the construction of a motorway through Transmission Gully and asked why 10 questions listed in the Mr Horne's written submission were not also included in the survey.

Mr Horne said the survey was biased in favour of building a motorway through Transmission Gully and therefore it should be disregarded.

A copy of Mr Horne's submission was circulated to members.
