Participation Through Petitions and Deputations: Public participation is also provided through the receipt of petitions and deputations. These are **normally** only received at appropriate Committee meetings.

- (b) Application to present petitions, or for deputations, shall set out their subject and be lodged with the General Manager at least five clear days before the date of the meeting concerned, and shall need the approval of the Chairperson. The Chairperson, in exceptional circumstances, may allow requests with less notice.
- 66. Unless the meeting determines otherwise, no more than two people presenting a petition, or on a deputation, may address **a** meeting. A limit of three minutes shall be placed on each of them. The Chairperson shall advise speakers in advance of these requirements. After a deputation, members may put pertinent questions to the speakers. No member shall express an opinion upon, or discuss the subject, or move motions until the deputation has completed making its submissions and answering questions.

Time Limits on Petitions and Deputations:

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
