Chairperson's Report

1. ARC Visit

We have heard much about Auckland's transport woes, and it was a useful benchmark to see first hand the current status of rail. I found the session on stormwater particularly interesting and believe that we have much to learn from Auckland on managing the adverse effects of runoff on our waterways and coasts.
