Release would be likely to prohibit future tenderers from tendering if they were aware that their names would be made public in advance of a tender decision being made. It is in the public interest that Greater Wellington receives tenders to ensure *Greater Wellington is able to* attract the best possible tenderers.

Release of the tender evaluation contained in the report would be likely to prejudice the commercial position of the tenderers as it would reveal their tender strategy and details of their operational methodology. In

Release of the 2007/08 budget for laboratory work would disadvantage the Council in its negotiations with the preferred tenderer and subsequent contract operations, as it would give an indication of the top price the Council would be willing to accept for the service.

Greater Wellington has not been able to identify a public interest favouring disclosure of this particular information above in public proceedings of the meeting that would override the identified prejudice.
