# **Divisional Manager's Report**

### 1. Purpose

# 4. Divisional matters

#### 4.1 BioWorks Manager Appointment

I am pleased to advise that Richard Grimmett will be taking on the part time role of managing BioWorks. Richard is currently Section Leader, Pest Plants within the Biosecurity Department. The new appointment will extend through to 30 June 2011, by which time the Council will have established a clear vision for possum and predator control within the region. A review of our pest delivery structures is then scheduled.

#### 4.2 ACC Audit

Greater Wellington recently applied to ACC for approval to secure secondary accreditation. Successful accreditation will result in reduced ACC fees and, more importantly, acknowledgement of strong health and safety systems within Greater Wellington.

ACC have recently indicated that two sites will be audited to assess whether secondary accreditation is appropriate. Sites selected include the Upper Hutt and Mabey Road Depots. The audit will cover the following Divisions and Departments:

Water Supply, Parks & Forest Division – Parks and Forestry Departments

Catchment Management Division – Biosecurity, Flood Protection, and Land Management Departments

Considerable preparatory work will be required by managers and health and safety representatives within each of the affected Departments prior to the audit on 11 November 2009.

#### 4.3 Flood Protection Field Trip

A field visit to a upper Ruamahanga River site will occur after the Catchment Management Committee meeting on 15 October. The principal objective will be to raise the Committees awareness of current and future issues confronting river engineers as they plan and implement river management schemes. It is proposed to have representatives from Fish & Game NZ, DoC, iwi, and river scheme committees present to provide their perspectives.

Communication and iwi liaison are planning an orientation event for staff that may be involved in the Wairarapa Moana project. The event will bring staff together from the five partners - Greater Wellington, DOC, South Wairarapa District Council, Rangitane o Wairarapa and Kahungunu ki Wairarapa, as well as regional field officers from Forest and Bird, Fish and Game, and Ministry of Fisheries.
