1.1 Communications

Key results for the quarter

- ▶ Emphasis was placed on integrated communications and social media. The Communications team created three regional parks videos (Kaitoke, Queen Elizabeth Park and Belmont) and posted them on YouTube. The videos were promoted through Our Region, radio advertising, social media including Facebook and Twitter, and on the council website.
- ► A video was also created to publicise the Great Outdoors Summer Events programme and formed the base artwork for the cover of the programme
- ▶ Logged and managed 115 media calls (October 66, November 29, December 20) compared to 228 in the previous quarter.
- ▶ Media monitoring and analysis of 308 articles (205 Neutral (67%), 90 Positive (29 %), 13 Negative (4%)
- ▶ As part of our public information management (PIM) role for Civil Defence, the team developed emergency pages for the new WREMO website which can be activated by any PIM in the region, in the event of an emergency. The site, which is hosted in the US, went live in November
