 - The opportunity for the public to make submissions as part of the Committee's consultation process
 - Legislative change to implement TPP obligations will be subject to the normal Parliamentary procedures, including select committee scrutiny and the passage of legislation through Parliament
 - Binding treaty action by the Executive will be subject to the completion of the aforementioned steps.
- 3. Instructs the Council Chair to write to the President of LGNZ, requesting that a local government evaluation, based on an independent analysis of the implications of the TPP for local government, and for the social, cultural, economic, environmental and health wellbeing of communities, be undertaken as a basis of LGNZ input into parliamentary consideration, and that the evaluation report should be made publicly available and widely publicised.

 - 3. The fare structure will be rationalised and simplified through the transition
 - 4. New IFT fares and products will minimise negative impacts on revenue and costs for GWRC and NZTA
 - 5. The transition to a new fare structure will be easy to implement, and introduced in stages rather than as a single event
 - 6. A network-wide approach will be used to rationalise fares across all modes
 - 7. Emerging but proven payment and ticketing technologies will be considered in implementing IFT
 - 8. Existing free transfers on and between bus and rail will be retained and any new transfers required as a result of changes to the network will avoid penalising customers
 - 9. The new fare structure and interim solutions will improve the quality of public transport data.
- 4. Notes that a Fares Transition Strategy, setting out a more developed pathway for fares transition, will be reported to the Sustainable Transport Committee in December 2015, prior to report to Council.
