Te Upoko Taiao – Natural Resources Plan Committee – adoption of terms of reference

1. Purpose

For Council to adopt the updated terms of reference for Te Upoko Taiao – Natural Resources Plan Committee (the Committee).

2. Background

As part of its review of the Committee, Council approved the draft updated terms of reference for the Committee for consultation with the six iwi authorities of the Wellington Region (**Attachment 1**) at its meeting on 5 April 2017.

Following the Council meeting, letters were sent to the six iwi authorities explaining that a number of changes were being proposed to the terms of reference to enable the Committee to function appropriately. The following changes were outlined in the letter:

- Change of Committee name to Te Upoko Taiao Natural Resources Plan Committee
- Change to the number of non-Councillor members of the Committee from seven to six
- Addition of oversight of Whaitua process
- Removal of oversight of RMA consenting functions.

The six iwi authorities were asked to forward any comments they had about the proposed updated draft terms of reference by Friday, 12 May 2017.

3. Comment

The following comments have been received:

Ātiawa ki Whakarongotai Charitable Trust	 Clause 7 – The previous rate was determined at \$500 per member incl. tax per daily rate for hui – It would be good to see the current rate explicitly detailed inside the TOR. Your consideration to include a clause in here regarding the 'replacement of non-councillor members' to this committee. i.e. Council will ensure that all non-councillor members continue to
	carry the support of their nominating iwi authority throughout their term of membership, and should the relevant iwi authority revoke their support for the nominated member that the council will receive and consider a nomination to replace the member from the said iwi authority? 3. Council to consider that non-councillor
	members have the ability to proxy or nominate a back-up representative who could attend hui in the case that our primary representative could not.
Kahungunu ki Wairarapa	No issues with the draft terms of reference.
Ngā Hapū ō Ōtaki	No comment received.
Ngati Toa Rangatira	No comment received.
Port Nicholson Block Settlement Trust	No issues with the draft terms of reference.
Rangitāne o Wairarapa	No comment received.

I will address the comments made by Ātiawa ki Whakarongotai Charitable Trust at the Council meeting.

4. Communication

The six iwi authorities in the Wellington Region will be advised that the updated terms of reference for the Committee have been adopted.

5. Consideration of climate change

The matters addressed in this report are of a procedural nature, and there is no need to conduct a climate change assessment.

6.1 Significance of the decision
