Mr Jones considers that the size of the proposed take is sufficiently small to have no appreciable effect on the water pressure in the aquifer, in particular at the McEwan Park monitoring site. Accordingly the proposed take will not increase the potential for sea water intrusion into the ground water system, nor will it exacerbate low pressures should they occur naturally or by pumping by other users.

Because the proposed take will operate under a redistribution of existing allocation the overall allocation of the Waiwhetu Artesian Aguifer is unaffected.

- You have indicated that it is "policy" to grant water rights of 10 or 15 years and no applications for renewal have ever been refused. You should however bear in mind that originally a 29 year water right was offered and accepted by the Council in good faith and that a very substantial reduction in this water right term has occurred due to misunderstandings at the Regional Council itself.
- You have said that the aquifer is "over-allocated". As you have yourself discerned, the water right at Petone Pure is contained within an existing water right and therefore *no further allocation* is taking place.
- You have said that the "force majeure conditions are ultra vires". We do not wish to get into too much Latin, but it is our experience that most contracts are observed, whether or not they are written down. Whether a professor somewhere might consider this type of arrangement to be ultra vires is actually quite beside the point. The point is that the integrity of Petone Pure would ensure that the citizens of Wellington were given first priority for supply and Petone Pure is fully and legally capable of including force majeure conditions in its own contracts of supply to the market place. It is our view, with respect, that you should not trouble yourself with concerns like these which are perceived to be negative and unhelpful.
- Petone Pure considers itself to be in a form of partnership with Greater Wellington. It is considered that the company will likely enhance the great reputation of Wellington water. Names under consideration are of course "Petone Pure" as the local icon brand but also "Hurricane Water", "Secret Spring", "Naturel Eau", "Naked Water" and others. The company plan

completely differentiates the use of the water right from many other users of water rights who may wash dishes or use water in an industrial way, in no way relevant to its great quality and reputation.

It is for the simple reason that the Petone Pure Water application is unique that you should consider the granting of the longer term than otherwise happens. You have said that you have to be "equitable to" other holders of water rights. We disagree because the Petone Pure proposal is unique and individual, and is utilising the water for the best purpose rather than just a source of "water".

At the end of the day the question is whether you find a positive about the water company or not. We have said, as people who inhabit the market place, that it is a complete negative for investors to see a water right curtailed from a 29 year term to something like 10 or 15. We have applied for 20 as a sensible compromise, recognising that, on this issue, the parties could have become estranged, but that was hardly productive or sensible given that there will be a long term working relationship, and a good story for Wellington.

We look forward to hearing from you soon and if we can assist by further discussing the length of the water right, then we are happy to attend at your place.
