





We consider a pumping test undertaken at the proposed rate of 10 litres/second or greater, as previously advised and suggested in Greater Wellington's (GW) pumping test guidelines, is required to adequately assess the effects of the proposed take.

1. Please undertake a pumping test at a rate of 10 litres/second or greater as per GW's pumping test guidelines and the advice previously provided. Also provide an analysis of the results and assessment of environmental effects.

We would be happy to review a proposed pumping test methodology for this test.

Surface water depletion assessment

Surface water depletion assessments are required by GW for takes greater than 5 litres/second.

2. Please provide a surface water depletion assessment for a proposed take of 10 litres/second. This should include the Hutt River and any nearby tributaries.

I have reviewed the above application and the attached AEE in support of the application. Your requirement:

Review pumping test results and analysis

The pumping test results and analysis are appropriate. The Theis solution method is applicable for such an analysis and aquifer responses to pumping at 4 l/s has been described correctly. I am satisfied that results and analysis from the pumping test represent aquifer conditions at that pumping rate. However,

• Are there any adverse drawdown effects in other wells?

I am satisfied that there are no drawdown effects on other wells if the wells are pumped at the tested pumping rate of 4 l/s as indicated in the drawdown analysis for this test.

· Yield of the aquifer

I am satisfied that the yield of the aquifer would not be adversely affected by an abstraction rate of 4 l/s or the proposed take of 10 l/s.

· Effects on surface water

I am satisfied that the effects of abstraction at 4 l/s on surface water will be less than minor. There is no stream depletion requirement to be undertaken for takes of less than 5 l/s.

However I am not able to recommend an allocation of 10 I/s for the duration of 16 hours per day (576 m³/day) based on the following:

1. The aquifer test was undertaken using a pumping rate of 4 l/s (a pumping test rate of equal or more than the proposed rate was recommended). Interpretations of potential drawdown pumping at 10 l/s based on such relatively low pumping rates (4 l/s) may result in underestimation of potential effects to other users. The aquifer at this location indicates localised variations in hydraulic conductivity with a potential of boundary effects when stressed at higher pumping rates. It is therefore only reasonable that the test be conducted at or above the proposed take for an acceptable duration as suggested in GW pumping test guidelines.

It is recommended that a stream depletion assessment be undertaken. Stream depletion assessments are required for groundwater takes greater than 5 l/s.

Comments: The application should be considered with monitoring conditions. However, a stream depletion assessment is required. The applicant may consider GW's guidelines on pumping tests and stream depletions assessments.





I have now read the Heretaunga Water Limited application and have one important question.

Why was the pumping test undertaken at 4 litres/second and not 10 litres/second or greater?

Our advice on the pumping test requirements was quite clear (see email 30 October 2009) that the pumping test should be undertaken at a rate that is at least or higher than the rate requested in the application. As the pumping test undertaken differed from our advice, a discussion should have been provided in the application as to why this was the case. Please advise.

I note that section 4.9 of the analysis and assessment report for the pumping test provides a brief discussion on an abstraction rate of 4 litres/second versus 10 litres/second. It also states why you consider a second pumping test at 10 litres/second is not considered necessary. We have not made a decision yet as to whether we agree with this.


