

- Introduction (keep it short)
 - What we were asked to do
 - How we achieved our work
 - Our overarching Principles & Values
- **Discussion** (key is to be punchy and to the point)
 - The key issues (quantified/qualitative/anecdotal)
 - The trade-offs
 - Co-designing and co-delivering on solutions
- Recommendations

When	What
November 23	Confirm Committee involvement in content and design development Agree content outline and process for seeking feedback from stakeholders and community
February 15 + March 8	Draft committee foreword, finalise content page and draft key themes
March 29, April 19	Develop 'propositions' strategy for socialising content with politicians, stakeholders, community
April - July	3-month engagement period; undertake engagement analysis Develop additional pieces to aid WIP dissemination, such as fact sheets, FAQ sheets
July	Draft WIP revised and agreed by Committee WIP presented to Council, WIP distributed through agreed channels
