Request for information 2022-116

I refer to your request for information dated 28 July 2022, which was received by Greater Wellington Regional Council (Greater Wellington) on 28 July 2022. You have requested the following:

"I am wanting to establish an audit trail of all correspondence, phone calls and file notes between staff or councillors of GWRC and to or from Kapiti Coast District Council staff or councillors or to or from any consultants or contractors or other agencies - regarding the state of recent flooding related to Peka Peka environs and specifically along Paetawa Road/Rutherford Dr.

Grateful if you can provide that information to me - covering the period 1 January 2021 through to today.

In addition to obtaining a complete audit trail of GWRC's knowledge and information covering this emergency situation, I am also endeavouring to establish if the GWRC understands the extent of problems, the issues and catastrophic effects caused to the ratepayers, GWRC's thoughts on solutions and any action they have taken to help or hinder possible solutions, and what urgency GWRC has afforded this growing emergency."

Greater Wellington's response follows:

...[A]ll correspondence, phone calls and file notes between staff or councillors of GWRC and to or from Kapiti Coast District Council staff or councillors or to or from any consultants or contractors or other agencies - regarding the state of recent flooding related to Peka Peka environs and specifically along Paetawa Road/Rutherford Dr.

Please find attached three attachments, which address your request.

We have withheld some information pertaining to names and personal contact information under section 7(2)(a) of the Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act 1987, to protect the privacy of natural persons, including that of deceased natural persons.

We have considered whether the public interest in the requested information outweighs Greater Wellington's need to withhold certain aspects of the requested correspondence. As a result, we do not consider that the public interest outweighs Greater Wellington's reason for withholding parts of the document under the grounds identified above.

If you have any concerns with the decision(s) referred to in this letter, you have the right to request an investigation and review by the Ombudsman under section 27(3) of the Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act 1987.

Additional information:

Greater Wellington Regional Council acknowledges that flooding has occurred in the Peka Peka environs and also acknowledges the inherent complexity in the relationship between the built and natural environment. At this time, national regulations present challenges to some means of flooding-prevention, however we will continue to provide advice to private landowners and Kāpiti Coast District Council on proposed solutions to address flooding issues

Please note that it is our policy to proactively release our responses to official information requests where possible. Our response to your request will be published shortly on Greater Wellington's website with your personal information removed.

Namesti & Kia Ora Daran and Nigel,

I'm writing this as a matter of urgency to bring to your attention the plight of just over 60 residents living along Waikanae's Paetawa Rd in proximity to the Pharazyn Ponds, the Te Harakeke Wetlands and the Ngarara Stream. Having read their concerns and completed a site visit on 19th July I am concerned for their health and safety as well as the potential impact on their property values. While this is my immediate concern, I am also looking at this as a back-to-the-future type case where this problem of rising groundwater levels today is a harbinger of what's going to rapidly unfold soon to our communities because of climate change.

In going back to the immediate concerns I'm particularly aware that a number of these lifestyle properties are dependent on on-site septic tanks under stress from rising groundwater levels thus increasing health risk. I'm also aware that a gas pipeline, owned by FirstGas, that's routed through this area has some 1 kilometre of its pipe submerged and therefore, I assume, there is a potential danger to this infrastructure. I understand that following appeals from residents my council had initiated contracting work to resume our stormwater maintenance obligations associated with the Ngarara Stream. But this had come to an abrupt stop given GWRC's responsibilities

under its Natural Resources Plan and its associated need to secure a consent with a caveat that even if an application is made there is no guarantee a consent would be granted. I further understand that the area of concern includes the Te Harakeke Wetlands with its significance underpinned by a QE II National Trust Covenant.

I think it's clear that the situation is a complex one, and the residents are fully cognisant of this, but in taking small bites of this elephant, the immediate danger to the residents needs to be addressed and my council can invoke its powers under emergency requirements to take immediate remedial actions and applying for a retrospective consent for the works. But I also understand the reluctance of my staff to invoke this when there is a possibility that in doing so a retrospective consent may be rejected leaving council in an invidious position. I'm not aware of such a situation to have the benefits of a case study. Given this, I have taken the unusual step of securing the pro bono advisory services of barrister [REDACTED] to help the local residents navigate through this complexity. I am grateful to [REDACTED] for his perception that what we are witnessing unravelling here is the precursor of potential legal challenges caused by the impact of climate change on coastal communities. I refer you to the observations made by [REDACTED] QC in a paper to a Local Government NZ conference "Who's afraid of creative judges" where he warns that a policy gap in managing climate change impacts will result in expensive legal challenges in court and resulting in the defacto outcomes where the courts end up making climate change policies via case law. We know this is already happening.

On that note, I have taken the liberty to alert Mr Jim Bolger, the Chair of our Coastal Advisory Panel looking at coastal adaptation, on what is happening to this coastal community along Paetawa Rd. Consultants providing expert evidence to this panel have noted that the coastal beach front along this stretch is accreting. My understanding is that the land beyond the beach front, where the residents are is much lower gradient. Effectively, they are hemmed-in and with increasing rain events and an unmanaged stormwater outlet they are in increasing danger to their health and properties.

Given the importance and value of the wetlands I had taken the liberty of seeking the advice of Mr Rob Cross, the Kapiti-Wellington officer for the QEII National Trust. He noted that he needs to secure the permission of his national office first but was kind enough to offer an initial guidance noting the complexity and the need for an ecological assessment on the flow of the Stream and its effects on the ecology of the wetland including its hydrology and whether changes affect its return to the natural state, and whether any 'clearance' would affect the Stream and wetland. It's useful to note that the governments Climate Change Adaptation Plan includes a template on risk assessment providing for the balance between a range of values including economic and environmental values but the experts providing technical evidence and advice to the panel chaired by Mr Bolger's are unlikely to present this compendium of measured risks in time to help our current problem. Mr Cross' observations also means additional time lapse. I'm bringing this to your attention to alert you to the wider issues dove-tailing into this immediate and justified concerns of the Paetawa Rd residents.

In my culture we have what Māori term a whakataukī...a proverb. "How do you fit an elephant into a pot?" We need the urgent clearance for KCDC to do the immediate work necessary and the ability to seek a retrospective consent through a process that recognises the climate change adaptation issues. It's also important for all parties involved in this case to work collaboratively and be seen publicly to be doing that to educate our communities on the challenges we face from climate changes and the way to secure community solutions. And not having to go through legal challenges. I appreciate your officers have started their communications directly with the residents and I look forward to your response.

I've also connected with Sean Mallon (KCDC Infrastructure Services GM) – our respective teams have begun to work this through.

A few key points in summary

- **Context** Highly complex situation. Stream clogged with veg and running through wetlands. Wetlands concerned are scheduled in the PNRP (ecological values and mana whenua significance) and covered by national regs. Navigating this is fairly tricky but not impossible. On the advice of Shaun and his team I firmly believe there's a way through it.
- **KCDC approach** KCDC is planning for both emergency works and possible longer term regular maintenance works.
- **Emergency works** I've discussed with Sean. KCDC are enabled to undertake emergency works as a network utility provider. This will be their decision to take but I did advise Sean to seek advice to make sure their approach is safe and sound legally. Limited works therefore could probably be undertaken in the short term but unlikely to cover the full KCDC/residents gamut of interest / opportunity. Retrospective consenting (following actual emergency works) also quite possible and if this does come to pass my team would work positively and constructively with KCDC to work this through.
- **Consenting time-frames** Retrospective consenting and particularly longer term global maintenance consenting will likely take months rather than weeks to work through.
- **GWRC operational interests** Flood Protection interests downstream on the Waimeha Stream – **Graeme** please fill in the gaps here.
- **Next regulatory steps** Alongside emergency works considerations. Sits with Sean Mallon and his team to draw up a set of possible options to bring to our team; possibly followed by a conversation with residents.

Namesti & Kia Ora Daran and Nigel,

I'm writing this as a matter of urgency to bring to your attention the plight of just over 60 residents living along Waikanae's Paetawa Rd in proximity to the Pharazyn Ponds, the Te Harakeke Wetlands and the Ngarara Stream. Having read their concerns and completed a site visit on 19th July I am concerned for their health and safety as well as the potential impact on their property values. While this is my immediate concern, I am also looking at this as a back-to-the-future type case where this problem of rising groundwater levels today is a harbinger of what's going to rapidly unfold soon to our communities because of climate change.

In going back to the immediate concerns I'm particularly aware that a number of these lifestyle properties are dependent on on-site septic tanks under stress from rising groundwater levels thus increasing health risk. I'm also aware that a gas pipeline, owned by FirstGas, that's routed through this area has some 1 kilometre of its pipe submerged and therefore, I assume, there is a potential danger to this infrastructure. I understand that following appeals from residents my council had initiated contracting work to resume our stormwater maintenance obligations associated with the Ngarara Stream. But this had come to an abrupt stop given GWRC's responsibilities

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I think it's clear that the situation is a complex one, and the residents are fully cognisant of this, but in taking small bites of this elephant, the immediate danger to the residents needs to be addressed and my council can invoke its powers under emergency requirements to take immediate remedial actions and applying for a retrospective consent for the works. But I also understand the reluctance of my staff to invoke this when there is a possibility that in doing so a retrospective consent may be rejected leaving council in an invidious position. I'm not aware of such a situation to have the benefits of a case study. Given this, I have taken the unusual step of securing the pro bono advisory services of barrister [REDACTED] to help the local residents navigate through this complexity. I am grateful to [REDACTED] for his perception that what we are witnessing unravelling here is the precursor of potential legal challenges caused by the impact of climate change on coastal communities. I refer you to the observations made by [REDACTED] QC in a paper to a Local Government NZ conference "Who's afraid of creative judges" where he warns that a policy gap in managing climate change impacts will result in expensive legal challenges in court and resulting in the defacto outcomes where the courts end up making climate change policies via case law. We know this is already happening.

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Given the importance and value of the wetlands I had taken the liberty of seeking the advice of Mr Rob Cross, the Kapiti-Wellington officer for the QEII National Trust. He noted that he needs to secure the permission of his national office first but was kind enough to offer an initial guidance noting the complexity and the need for an ecological assessment on the flow of the Stream and its effects on the ecology of the wetland including its hydrology and whether changes affect its return to the natural state, and whether any 'clearance' would affect the Stream and wetland. It's useful to note that the governments Climate Change Adaptation Plan includes a template on risk assessment providing for the balance between a range of values including economic and environmental values but the experts providing technical evidence and advice to the panel chaired by Mr Bolger's are unlikely to present this compendium of measured risks in time to help our current problem. Mr Cross' observations also means additional time lapse. I'm bringing this to your attention to alert you to the wider issues dove-tailing into this immediate and justified concerns of the Paetawa Rd residents.

- **Context:** Highly complex situation. Stream clogged with veg and running through wetlands. Wetlands concerned are scheduled in the PNRP (ecological values and mana whenua significance) and covered by national regs. Navigating this is fairly tricky but not impossible. On the advice of Shaun and his team, I firmly believe there's a way through it.
- **KCDC approach:** KCDC is planning for both emergency works, and possible longer term regular maintenance works.
- **Emergency works:** I've discussed with Sean. KCDC are enabled to undertake emergency works as a network utility provider. This will be their decision to take, but I did advise Sean to seek advice to make sure their approach is safe and sound legally. Limited works therefore could probably be undertaken in the short term, but unlikely to cover the full KCDC/residents gamut of interest / opportunity. Retrospective consenting (following actual emergency works) also quite possible, and if this does come to pass my team would work positively and constructively with KCDC to work this through.
- **Consenting time-frames:** Retrospective consenting and particularly longer term global maintenance consenting will likely take months rather than weeks to work through.
- **GWRC operational interests:** Flood Protection interests downstream on the Waimeha Stream. **GWRC primarily undertake the maintenance work on the Waimeha Stream at the mouth (coastal section) and then the Waimeha stream above the confluence with the Ngarara Stream. The area that are of concern at this stage are those bits on the Ngarara Stream above the confluence with the Waimeha.**
- **Next regulatory steps:** Alongside emergency works considerations. Sits with Sean Mallon and his team to draw up a set of possible options to bring to our team; possibly followed by a conversation with residents.

On that note, I have taken the liberty to alert Mr Jim Bolger, the Chair of our Coastal Advisory Panel looking at coastal adaptation, on what is happening to this coastal community along Paetawa Rd. Consultants providing expert evidence to this panel have noted that the coastal beach front along this stretch is accreting. My understanding is that the land beyond the beach front, where the residents are is much lower gradient. Effectively, they are hemmed-in and with increasing rain events and an unmanaged stormwater outlet they are in increasing danger to their health and properties.

I'm writing this as a matter of urgency to bring to your attention the plight of just over 60 residents living along Waikanae's Paetawa Rd in proximity to the Pharazyn Ponds, the Te Harakeke Wetlands and the Ngarara Stream. Having read their concerns and completed a site visit on 19th July I am concerned for their health and safety as well as the potential impact on their property values. While this is my immediate concern, I am also looking at this as a back-to-the-future type case where this problem of rising groundwater levels today is a harbinger of what's going to rapidly unfold soon to our communities because of climate change.

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QC in a paper to a Local Government NZ conference "Who's afraid of creative judges" where he warns that a policy gap in managing climate change impacts will result in expensive legal challenges in court and resulting in the defacto outcomes where the courts end up making climate change policies via case law. We know this is already happening.

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In my culture we have what Māori term a whakataukī...a proverb. "How do you fit an elephant into a pot?" We need the urgent clearance for KCDC to do the immediate work necessary and the ability to seek a retrospective consent through a process that recognises the climate change adaptation issues. It's also important for all parties involved in this case to work collaboratively and be seen publicly to be doing that to educate our communities on the challenges we face from climate changes and the way to secure community solutions. And not having to go through legal challenges. I appreciate your officers have started their communications directly with the residents and I look forward to your response.

Tēna koe Mayor Guru

Many thanks for your email of 29 July, and for drawing an issue that's both urgent and complex to our attention. I am replying on behalf of Daran, as this primarily sits with GW officers to resolve at this point. Longer term as you say, GW and KCDC, together with our mana whenua partners and other stakeholders, will need to work together to meet this challenge.

Firstly let me note that Cr Gaylor and Al Cross our General Manager of the GW Environment Management Group connected the chair of the residents group last week. Al has also connected with Sean Mallon at KCDC to work towards a resolution of the urgent flooding issue. Our respective GW and KCDC teams have begun to work this through.

In summary there are several key points at the top of our minds

- **Context:** *This is a highly complex situation. The stream is clogged with vegetation and running through wetlands, which are in turn scheduled in the PNRP (ecological values and mana whenua significance) and covered by national regulations. Navigating this is fairly tricky but still possible. On the advice of GW's Environmental Regulation team, we firmly believe there's a way through it.*
- **KCDC approach:** *We understand that KCDC is planning for both emergency works, and possible longer term regular maintenance works.*
- **North Island gas main:** *Part of the main gas line is now submerged in water, and this has now come to the attention of First Gas, the pipeline operator.*
- **Emergency works:** *As discussed with Sean Mallon, KCDC can undertake emergency works as a network utility provider. This is your decision to take, noting that we have advised Sean to seek advice to make sure your approach is safe and sound legally. Limited works therefore could probably be undertaken in the short term, but they are unlikely to cover the full KCDC/residents gamut of interest / opportunity.*

Retrospective consenting (following actual emergency works) is also quite possible, and if this does come to pass GW's E Reg team would work positively and constructively with KCDC through the necessary process.

- **Consenting time-frames:** *Retrospective consenting and particularly longer term global*

maintenance consenting will likely take months rather than weeks to work through.

- **GW operational interests:** *GW Flood Protection primarily undertakes the maintenance work on the Waimeha Stream at the mouth (coastal section) and then the Waimeha stream above the confluence with the Ngarara Stream. The areas of concern at this stage are those bits on the **Ngarara Stream** above the confluence with the Waimeha.*
- **Next regulatory steps:** *Alongside emergency works considerations. Sean Mallon and his team need to draw up a set of possible options to bring to our team; possibly followed by a conversation with residents.*

Noting all these points above, we also recognise the wider issues and longer term challenges to be addressed, through working together and with the community in a highly collaborative manner. We will have the opportunity to do so through development of the Kāpiti Whaitua Committee's development of their Implementation Programme. However, this situation is one example of a broader challenge for all of us working in this space, and it will remain a strategic priority for us over the next number of years. GW looks forward to working with KCDC and our partners on finding ways forward to resolution.

Having read their concerns and completed a site visit on 19th July I am concerned for their health and safety as well as the potential impact on their property values. While this is my immediate concern, I am also looking at this as a back-to-the-future type case where this problem of rising groundwater levels today is a harbinger of what's going to rapidly unfold soon to our communities because of climate change.

In going back to the immediate concerns I'm particularly aware that a number of these lifestyle properties are dependent on on-site septic tanks under stress from rising groundwater levels thus increasing health risk. I'm also aware that a gas pipeline, owned by FirstGas, that's routed through this area has some 1 kilometre of its pipe submerged and therefore, I assume, there is a potential danger to this infrastructure. I understand that following appeals from residents my council had initiated contracting work to resume our stormwater maintenance obligations associated with the Ngarara Stream. But this had come to an abrupt stop given GWRC's responsibilities under its Natural Resources Plan and its associated need to secure a consent with a caveat that even if an application is made there is no guarantee a consent would be granted. I further understand that the area of concern includes the Te Harakeke Wetlands with its significance underpinned by a QE II National Trust Covenant.

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Given the importance and value of the wetlands I had taken the liberty of seeking the advice of Mr Rob Cross, the Kapiti-Wellington officer for the QEII National Trust. He noted that he needs to secure the permission of his national office first but was kind enough to offer an initial guidance noting the complexity and the need for an ecological assessment on the flow of the Stream and

its effects on the ecology of the wetland including its hydrology and whether changes affect its return to the natural state, and whether any 'clearance' would affect the Stream and wetland.

It's useful to note that the governments Climate Change Adaptation Plan includes a template on risk assessment providing for the balance between a range of values including economic and environmental values but the experts providing technical evidence and advice to the panel chaired by Mr Bolger's are unlikely to present this compendium of measured risks in time to help our current problem. Mr Cross' observations also means additional time lapse. I'm bringing this to your attention to alert you to the wider issues dove-tailing into this immediate and justified concerns of the Paetawa Rd residents.

I think it's clear that the situation is a complex one, and the residents are fully cognisant of this, but in taking small bites of this elephant, the immediate danger to the residents needs to be addressed and my council can invoke its powers under emergency requirements to take immediate remedial actions and applying for a retrospective consent for the works. But I also understand the reluctance of my staff to invoke this when there is a possibility that in doing so a retrospective consent may be rejected leaving council in an invidious position. I'm not aware of such a situation to have the benefits of a case study. Given this, I have taken the unusual step of securing the pro bono advisory services of barrister [REDACTED] to help the local residents navigate through this complexity. I am grateful to [REDACTED] for his perception that what we are witnessing unravelling here is the precursor of potential legal challenges caused by the impact of climate change on coastal communities. I refer you to the observations made by [REDACTED] QC in a paper to a Local Government NZ conference "Who's afraid of creative judges" where he warns that a policy gap in managing climate change impacts will result in expensive legal challenges in court and resulting in the defacto outcomes where the courts end up making climate change policies via case law. We know this is already happening.

On that note, I have taken the liberty to alert Mr Jim Bolger, the Chair of our Coastal Advisory Panel looking at coastal adaptation, on what is happening to this coastal community along Paetawa Rd. Consultants providing expert evidence to this panel have noted that the coastal beach front along this stretch is accreting. My understanding is that the land beyond the beach front, where the residents are is much lower gradient. Effectively, they are hemmed-in and with increasing rain events and an unmanaged stormwater outlet they are in increasing danger to their health and properties.

Retrospective consenting (following actual emergency works) also quite possible, and if this does come to pass my team would positively and constructively with KCDC to work this through.
- **Consenting time-frames:** Retrospective consenting and particularly longer term global maintenance consenting will likely take months rather than weeks to work through.
- **GWRC operational interests:** Flood Protection interests downstream on the Waimeha Stream – **Graeme**, please fill in the gaps here.
- **Next regulatory steps:** Alongside emergency works considerations. Sits with Sean Mallon and his team to draw up a set of possible options to bring to our team; possibly followed by a conversation with residents.

Happy to support action to respond to the Mayor.

Namesti & Kia Ora Daran and Nigel,

I'm writing this as a matter of urgency to bring to your attention the plight of just over 60 residents living along Waikanae's Paetawa Rd in proximity to the Pharazyn Ponds, the Te Harakeke Wetlands and the Ngarara Stream. Having read their concerns and completed a site visit on 19th July I am concerned for their health and safety as well as the potential impact on their property values. While this is my immediate concern, I am also looking at this as a back-to-the-future type case where this problem of rising groundwater levels today is a harbinger of what's going to rapidly unfold soon to our communities because of climate change.

In going back to the immediate concerns I'm particularly aware that a number of these lifestyle properties are dependent on on-site septic tanks under stress from rising groundwater levels thus increasing health risk. I'm also aware that a gas pipeline, owned by FirstGas, that's routed through this area has some 1 kilometre of its pipe submerged and therefore, I assume, there is a potential danger to this infrastructure. I understand that following appeals from residents my council had initiated contracting work to resume our stormwater maintenance obligations associated with the Ngarara Stream. But this had come to an abrupt stop given GWRC's responsibilities

under its Natural Resources Plan and its associated need to secure a consent with a caveat that even if an application is made there is no guarantee a consent would be granted. I further understand that the area of concern includes the Te Harakeke Wetlands with its significance underpinned by a QE II National Trust Covenant.

I think it's clear that the situation is a complex one, and the residents are fully cognisant of this, but in taking small bites of this elephant, the immediate danger to the residents needs to be addressed and my council can invoke its powers under emergency requirements to take immediate remedial actions and applying for a retrospective consent for the works. But I also understand the reluctance of my staff to invoke this when there is a possibility that in doing so a retrospective consent may be rejected leaving council in an invidious position. I'm not aware of such a situation to have the benefits of a case study. Given this, I have taken the unusual step of securing the pro bono advisory services of barrister [REDACTED] to help the local residents navigate through this complexity. I am grateful to [REDACTED] for his perception that what we are witnessing unravelling here is the precursor of potential legal challenges caused by the impact of climate change on coastal communities. I refer you to the observations made by [REDACTED] QC in a paper to a Local Government NZ conference "Who's afraid of creative judges" where he warns that a policy gap in managing climate change impacts will result in expensive legal challenges in court and resulting in the defacto outcomes where the courts end up making climate change policies via case law. We know this is already happening.

On that note, I have taken the liberty to alert Mr Jim Bolger, the Chair of our Coastal Advisory Panel looking at coastal adaptation, on what is happening to this coastal community along Paetawa Rd. Consultants providing expert evidence to this panel have noted that the coastal beach front along this stretch is accreting. My understanding is that the land beyond the beach front, where the residents are is much lower gradient. Effectively, they are hemmed-in and with increasing rain events and an unmanaged stormwater outlet they are in increasing danger to their health and properties.

Given the importance and value of the wetlands I had taken the liberty of seeking the advice of Mr Rob Cross, the Kapiti-Wellington officer for the QEII National Trust. He noted that he needs to secure the permission of his national office first but was kind enough to offer an initial guidance noting the complexity and the need for an ecological assessment on the flow of the Stream and its effects on the ecology of the wetland including its hydrology and whether changes affect its return to the natural state, and whether any 'clearance' would affect the Stream and wetland. It's useful to note that the governments Climate Change Adaptation Plan includes a template on risk assessment providing for the balance between a range of values including economic and environmental values but the experts providing technical evidence and advice to the panel chaired by Mr Bolger's are unlikely to present this compendium of measured risks in time to help our current problem. Mr Cross' observations also means additional time lapse. I'm bringing this to your attention to alert you to the wider issues dove-tailing into this immediate and justified concerns of the Paetawa Rd residents.

In my culture we have what Māori term a whakataukī...a proverb. "How do you fit an elephant into a pot?" We need the urgent clearance for KCDC to do the immediate work necessary and the ability to seek a retrospective consent through a process that recognises the climate change adaptation issues. It's also important for all parties involved in this case to work collaboratively and be seen publicly to be doing that to educate our communities on the challenges we face from climate changes and the way to secure community solutions. And not having to go through legal challenges. I appreciate your officers have started their communications directly with the residents and I look forward to your response.

Many thanks for your email of 29 July, and for drawing to our attention an issue that's both urgent and complex. I am replying on behalf of Daran, as this primarily sits with GW officers to respond to at this point, working with the KCDC team. Longer term as you say, GW and KCDC, together with our mana whenua partners and other stakeholders, will need to work together to meet this challenge.

Firstly let me note my understanding is that Cr Gaylor and Al Cross our General Manager of the GW Environment Management Group connected with [REDACTED], the chair of the residents group last week. Al has also connected with Sean Mallon at KCDC to work towards a resolution of the urgent flooding issue. Our respective GW and KCDC teams have begun to work this through.

In summary there are several key points at the top of our minds:

- **Context:** This is a highly complex situation. The Ngarara Stream is clogged with vegetation and running through wetlands, which are in turn scheduled in the PNRP (ecological values and mana whenua significance) and covered by national regulations. Navigating this is fairly tricky but still possible. On the advice of GW's Environmental Regulation (EReg) team, we firmly believe there's a way through it despite the high level of regulatory protection.
- **KCDC approach:** We understand that KCDC is planning for both emergency works, and possible longer term regular maintenance works.
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- **Emergency works:** As Al has discussed with Sean Mallon, KCDC can undertake emergency works as a network utility provider. This is KCDC's decision to take, noting that Al has advised Sean to seek advice to make sure your approach is safe and sound legally. Limited works therefore could probably be undertaken in the short term, but they are unlikely to cover the full KCDC/residents breadth of interest / opportunity.

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conversation with residents.

- **GW operational interests:** GW Flood Protection primarily undertakes the maintenance work on the Waimeha Stream at the mouth (coastal section) and then the Waimeha stream above the confluence with the Ngarara Stream. The areas of concern at this stage are those bits on the Ngarara Stream above the confluence with the Waimeha.

GW Flood Protection has experience in applying for consents to work in highly modified watercourses and we are happy to share lessons learned if that might be useful to KCDC in applying for global consents.

Noting all these points above, we also recognise the wider issues and longer term challenges to be addressed, through working together and with the community in a highly collaborative manner. We may have the opportunity to do so through the Kāpiti Whaitua Committee's development of their Whaitua Implementation Programme.

However, as you noted this situation is one example of a broader challenge for all of us responding to the emerging climate change situation, and it will remain a strategic priority for us over a good number of years to come. GW looks forward to working with KCDC and our partners on finding ways forward to resolution.

Paul, I thought I'd come back to you quickly, following our discussion this morning, and the subsequent call I placed with Al Cross ... as a couple of useful clarification points have emerged.

Firstly, the immediate plan you are working on to clear the remainder of vegetative blocking in

the Ngarara Stream, does not need to be shared with GWRC. Al is firmly of the opinion that this falls within the emergency powers provision, and is entirely for KCDC to develop and apply, in completing the urgent tasks at hand.

Secondly, an action plan covering a longer term view of remedial and/or maintenance activities in and around the Ngarara Stream, does need to be shared with GWRC. At this stage it's more important that the substantive components are presented, so that consenting-related discussions can get underway - but preparation of that should not get in the way of the immediate actions required for stream clearance.

Thirdly, and just to reiterate this, KCDC's ability to institute and complete the envisaged urgent clearance of this modified waterway, can be fully completed under the emergency powers provisions ... which Al is sure allows KCDC to circumvent the normal consenting process (for that scope of work only), to complete the clearance activities in the shortest time possible.

has been providing information to Paul Busing about various non-complying activities that need to be met namely:

1. R54 of the Resource Management (NESF) Regulations.

Within the 50 member Peka Peka group, questions have been asked about whether a resource consent was issued to allow the wetland to expand, and that damming, diverting and discharging water within 100 m of a wetland stated in R54(c) (because of a lack of maintenance) is a non-complying activity which has caused all these problems in the first instance but has been overlooked.

2. The other rule that Nick quoted is Rule R110 of the proposed Natural Resourced Plan.

I can't find any draft of it and from what I can see this plan is not operational because it's going through an appeal process, so I don't understand how this can be referred to. From what I can see it's the regional plan that is the operational plan. Is this correct? Within it there are sections that are highly relevant to the situation in Peka Peka namely:

Disna/Sean, we need to set a date for the meeting with a suitably senior GWRC representative, given that we're all seeking their pragmatic approval to resume the clearance of the Ngarara Stream - at least from the Black Drain and Ngarara Stream convergence, down to the Waikanae Golf Course.

The urgency of this continues to be of critical importance to peoples' livelihoods, health and safety, and mental wellbeing.

I've just received an E-Mail from Paul Busing, where he's forwarded the latest response from GWRC, regarding their position, and the fact they can't meet with us this week.

Of the date options Paul mentions, the week beginning 28 July is far too late, and we really need it to happen as early as possible in the week beginning 18 July. I understand that Jocelyn is going to be away at conference later that week, so ideally we need to organise the session on Monday or Tuesday (18th or 19th July).

As you know, their representative needs to be senior enough to quickly authorise stream-clearance even if it means retrospectively issuing a consent, if one is in fact needed ... and also familiar enough with this part of their portfolio, that they understand the big picture, and that a middle ground is both being sought, and is possible.

The stated requirement for a GWRC resource consent being necessary, is in direct contrast to that provided by [REDACTED] when he meet with us on 1 July at the Pharazyn Reserve. He stated that no resource consent was required from GWRC, when vegetation only was to be removed from the Ngarara Stream in the vicinity of the wetland area.

An apparent paradox in respect of this stuff, is that a resource consent is required to extend a wetland because of any unplanned negative effects. It is my understanding that no resource consent or consents have been issued to permit the wetland areas to the north and south of the Pharazyn Reserve to be extended. Could you confirm if this is correct please ?

As I understand it, you are keen to identify a suitable window for the resumption and completion of this work. This must be completed by the end of August, if we are not to be stopped in our tracks by the season of fish migration and spawning.

Assuming 16 days is required to complete the work (based on the Goodmans estimate), that work must commence no later than 10 August.

We are keen to know what KCDC staff are doing as background work to expedite this process, and whether our group can help in any way.

For your further information, please be aware that we met with the party who raised some concerns about the nature of the clearance recently completed to the drain adjacent to the Black Swamp.

While they had concerns about how some of that vegetation was removed, they are in full agreement that the balance of the Ngarara Stream clearance should go ahead ... and quickly.

They also reaffirmed our view that any undue delay will see further inundation and damage south of the Pharazyn Ponds, should the pond's banks be overwhelmed by the remaining Winter and Spring rain events. An outcome which is highly likely.

Although the Black Drain has recently been cleaned out, water levels near Peka Peka Road have risen by 4 cm. If you work out the area of just that inundated land alone, that is a massive amount of water.

Please get back to us as soon as possible, and we will make ourselves available to meet with the GWRC folks - whether at your office, or (more desirably) on one of the affected properties.

As discussed on Friday, Jocelyn is keeping Penny Taylor abreast of these matters, and seeking her help for further contact within GWRC, as appropriate.

On 9/07/2022, at 7:49 AM, [REDACTED] wrote:

Yesterday, we attended a meeting with the Stormwater team at the Council offices, fully expecting it to be collegiate in nature, and looking forward to completion of critical drain clearance work, which had been described in writing only two days previously.

Instead, we were left bereft in the office vacated by the team, as we saw the promised deliveries from only 48 hours earlier, go up in smoke.

I now have to reverse the positive message I was able to provide to our Kawakahia Community Group members in that same timeframe, who've been with us in the journey of the last several months.

I have to explain why they now have to endure repeated flood events through the upcoming Winter and Spring months, with absolutely no assurances that anything further will be done to avoid further disasters to their properties - and their way of life.

I have to explain why a course of action which would mitigate, and potentially reverse extensive and financially damaging flooding of their properties, is no longer happening in the next few weeks (as promised) ... and is at best now not going to happen for the best part of six months (!), and potentially ruled out entirely !

Mayor Guru, you asked in a previous E-Mail, that we keep you informed of progress. Well here it is. Nothing.

In our area of interest, and sitting on top of multiple properties in Peka Peka, is a vast body of water ... which at a conservative estimate is **450,000 cubic metres** (or **450million litres**) in size.

This was caused when drainage in the area was reversed (due to lack of maintenance for over 25 years), and basically backfilled into that area.

During the December rain event of last year, that water level was even higher, and was lapping into the Pharazyn ponds.

If drainage efficiency is not recovered immediately - which is imminently possible based on earlier feedback from your Stormwater team, other significant weather events in the coming months will cause the water body to expand again.

It will reach new tipping points, and inundate other areas spared so far.

Effectively, the water will move the only way it can. South down the inland channel to engulf the Waikanae Golf Course, and further South to affect roads and properties in Waikanae.

And let's not forget that flooding encountered by residents and ratepayers to date, has submerged multiple septic tank installations. These are not the newer sealed units, but ones where (now) untreated effluent has entered and continues to spread throughout the surface water affecting the region in question.

These critical health and safety concerns are compounded for those those residents who have animals on the property - domestic and grazing, and by virtually every member of our 60+ households who have suffered land damage, plus plant and mature tree kill-off, costing many thousands of dollars to remove and/or replace them throughout the settlement.

Your team has indicated that the halt in the clearance activities is caused by eco-related constraints applied by the Greater Wellington Regional Council.

We and your team believe, that a middle ground can be found here, which reverses the flooding, yet does not damage the eco aspirations of council(s) and residents alike.

After a lengthy discussion during the meeting on Friday, we repeated our previous offer (from March) to host representatives from KCDC and GWRC on on some of the properties lying under the inland water mass.

In fact we insisted that your Council arrange an urgent meeting with a suitably authorised and informed member of GWRC, who has the ability to see the bigger picture here, and agree to progress a sensible route forward.

We look forward to an invitation to a combined Kawakahia, KCDC, and GWRC session next week, to get this done.

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On that note, I have taken the liberty to alert Mr Jim Bolger, the Chair of our Coastal Advisory Panel looking at coastal adaptation, on what is happening to this coastal community along Paetawa Rd. Consultants providing expert evidence to this panel have noted that the coastal beach front along this stretch is accreting. My understanding is that the land beyond the beach front, where the residents are is much lower gradient. Effectively, they are hemmed-in and with increasing rain events and an unmanaged stormwater outlet they are in increasing danger to

their health and properties.

Given the importance and value of the wetlands I had taken the liberty of seeking the advice of Mr Rob Cross, the Kapiti-Wellington officer for the QEII National Trust. He noted that he needs to secure the permission of his national office first but was kind enough to offer an initial guidance noting the complexity and the need for an ecological assessment on the flow of the Stream and its effects on the ecology of the wetland including its hydrology and whether changes affect its return to the natural state, and whether any 'clearance' would affect the Stream and wetland.

It's useful to note that the governments Climate Change Adaptation Plan includes a template on risk assessment providing for the balance between a range of values including economic and environmental values but the experts providing technical evidence and advice to the panel chaired by Mr Bolger's are unlikely to present this compendium of measured risks in time to help our current problem. Mr Cross' observations also means additional time lapse. I'm bringing this to your attention to alert you to the wider issues dove-tailing into this immediate and justified concerns of the Paetawa Rd residents.

In my culture we have what Māori term a whakataukī...a proverb. "How do you fit an elephant into a pot?" We need the urgent clearance for KCDC to do the immediate work necessary and the ability to seek a retrospective consent through a process that recognises the climate change adaptation issues. It's also important for all parties involved in this case to work collaboratively and be seen publicly to be doing that to educate our communities on the challenges we face from climate changes and the way to secure community solutions. And not having to go through legal challenges. I appreciate your officers have started their communications directly with the residents and I look forward to your response.

Both Penny and I have linked with the chair of the residents group last week.

I've also connected with Sean Mallon (KCDC Infrastructure Services GM) – our respective teams have begun to work this through.

A few key points in summary:

- **Context:** Highly complex situation. Stream clogged with veg and running through wetlands. Wetlands concerned are scheduled in the PNRP (ecological values and mana whenua significance) and covered by national regs. Navigating this is fairly tricky but not impossible. On the advice of Shaun and his team, I firmly believe there's a way through it.
- **KCDC approach:** KCDC is planning for both emergency works, and possible longer term regular maintenance works.
- **Emergency works:** I've discussed with Sean. KCDC are enabled to undertake emergency works as a network utility provider. This will be their decision to take, but I did advise Sean to seek advice to make sure their approach is safe and sound legally. Limited works therefore could probably be undertaken in the short term, but unlikely to cover the full KCDC/residents gamut of interest / opportunity. Retrospective consenting (following actual emergency works) also quite possible, and if this does come to pass my team would work positively and constructively with KCDC to work this through.
- **Consenting time-frames:** Retrospective consenting and particularly longer term global maintenance consenting will likely take months rather than weeks to work through.
- **GWRC operational interests:** Flood Protection interests downstream on the Waimeha Stream – **Graeme**, please fill in the gaps here.

- **Next regulatory steps:** Alongside emergency works considerations. Sits with Sean Mallon and his team to draw up a set of possible options to bring to our team; possibly followed by a conversation with residents.

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Given the importance and value of the wetlands I had taken the liberty of seeking the advice of Mr Rob Cross, the Kapiti-Wellington officer for the QEII National Trust. He noted that he needs to secure the permission of his national office first but was kind enough to offer an initial guidance noting the complexity and the need for an ecological assessment on the flow of the Stream and its effects on the ecology of the wetland including its hydrology and whether changes affect its return to the natural state, and whether any 'clearance' would affect the Stream and wetland. It's useful to note that the government's Climate Change Adaptation Plan includes a template on risk assessment providing for the balance between a range of values including economic and environmental values but the experts providing technical evidence and advice to the panel chaired by Mr Bolger's are unlikely to present this compendium of measured risks in time to help our current problem. Mr Cross' observations also means additional time lapse. I'm bringing this to your attention to alert you to the wider issues dovetailing into this immediate and justified concerns of the Paetawa Rd residents.

Namesti & Kia Ora Daran and Nigel,

I'm writing this as a matter urgency to bring to your attention the plight of just over 60 residents living along Waikanae's Paetawa Rd in proximity to the Pharazyn Ponds, the Te Harakeke Wetlands and the Ngarara Stream. Having read their concerns and completed a site visit on 19th July I am concerned for their health and safety as well as the potential impact on their property values. While this is my immediate concern, I am also looking at this as a back-to-the-future type case where this problem of rising groundwater levels today is a harbinger of what's going to rapidly unfold soon to our communities because of climate change.

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On that note, I have taken the liberty to alert Mr Jim Bolger, the Chair of our Coastal Advisory Panel looking at coastal adaptation, on what is happening to this coastal community along Paetawa Rd. Consultants providing expert evidence to this panel have noted that the coastal beach front along this stretch is accreting. My understanding is that the land beyond the beach front, where the residents are is much lower gradient. Effectively, they are hemmed-in and with increasing rain events and an unmanaged stormwater outlet they are in increasing danger to their health and properties.

Tēna koe Mayor Guru

Many thanks for your email of 29 July, and for drawing to our attention an issue that's both urgent and complex. I am replying on behalf of Daran, as this primarily sits with GW officers to respond to at this point, working with the KCDC team. Longer term as you say, GW and KCDC, together with our mana whenua partners and other stakeholders, will need to work together to meet this challenge.

Firstly let me note my understanding is that Cr Gaylor and Al Cross our General Manager of the GW Environment Management Group connected with [REDACTED], the chair of the residents group last week. Al has also connected with Sean Mallon at KCDC to work towards a resolution of the urgent flooding issue. Our respective GW and KCDC teams have begun to work this through.

In summary there are several key points at the top of our minds:

Navigating this is fairly tricky but still possible. On the advice of GW's Environmental Regulation (EReg) team, we firmly believe there's a way through it despite the high level of regulatory protection.
- **KCDC approach:** We understand that KCDC is planning for both emergency works, and possible longer term regular maintenance works.
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Retrospective consenting (following actual emergency works) is also quite possible, and if this does come to pass GW's EReg team would work positively and constructively with KCDC through the necessary process.

- **Consenting time-frames:** Retrospective consenting and particularly longer term global maintenance consenting will likely take months rather than weeks to work through.
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GW Flood Protection has experience in applying for consents to work in highly modified watercourses and we are happy to share lessons learned if that might be useful to KCDC in applying for global consents.

Noting all these points above, we also recognise the wider issues and longer term challenges to be addressed, through working together and with the community in a highly collaborative manner. We may have the opportunity to do so through the Kāpiti Whaitua Committee's development of their Whaitua Implementation Programme.

However, as you noted this situation is one example of a broader challenge for all of us responding to the emerging climate change situation, and it will remain a strategic priority for us over a good number of years to come. GW looks forward to working with KCDC and our partners on finding ways forward to resolution.

Namesti & Kia Ora Daran and Nigel,

I'm writing this as a matter of urgency to bring to your attention the plight of just over 60 residents living along Waikanae's Paetawa Rd in proximity to the Pharazyn Ponds, the Te Harakeke Wetlands and the Ngarara Stream. Having read their concerns and completed a site visit on 19th July I am concerned for their health and safety as well as the potential impact on their property values. While this is my immediate concern, I am also looking at this as a back-to-the-future type case where this problem of rising groundwater levels today is a harbinger of what's going to rapidly unfold soon to our communities because of climate change.

In going back to the immediate concerns I'm particularly aware that a number of these lifestyle properties are dependent on on-site septic tanks under stress from rising groundwater levels thus increasing health risk. I'm also aware that a gas pipeline, owned by FirstGas, that's routed through this area has some 1 kilometre of its pipe submerged and therefore, I assume, there is a potential danger to this infrastructure. I understand that following appeals from residents my council had initiated contracting work to resume our stormwater maintenance obligations associated with the Ngarara Stream. But this had come to an abrupt stop given GWRC's responsibilities under its Natural Resources Plan and its associated need to secure a consent with a caveat that even if an application is made there is no guarantee a consent would be granted. I further understand that the area of concern includes the Te Harakeke Wetlands with its significance underpinned by a QE II National Trust Covenant.

I think it's clear that the situation is a complex one, and the residents are fully cognisant of this, but in taking small bites of this elephant, the immediate danger to the residents needs to be addressed and my council can invoke its powers under emergency requirements to take immediate remedial actions and applying for a retrospective consent for the works. But I also understand the reluctance of my staff to invoke this when there is a possibility that in doing so a retrospective consent may be rejected leaving council in an invidious position. I'm not aware of such a situation to have the benefits of a case study. Given this, I have taken the unusual step of securing the pro bono advisory services of barrister [REDACTED] to help the local residents navigate through this complexity. I am grateful to [REDACTED] for his perception that what we are witnessing unravelling here is the precursor of potential legal challenges caused by the impact of climate change on coastal communities. I refer you to the observations made by Mr [REDACTED] QC in a paper to a Local Government NZ conference "Who's afraid of creative judges" where he warns that a policy gap in managing climate change impacts will result in expensive legal challenges in court and resulting in the defacto outcomes where the courts end up making climate change policies via case law. We know this is already happening.

On that note, I have taken the liberty to alert Mr Jim Bolger, the Chair of our Coastal Advisory Panel looking at coastal adaptation, on what is happening to this coastal community along Paetawa Rd. Consultants providing expert evidence to this panel have noted that the coastal beach front along this stretch is accreting. My understanding is that the land beyond the beach front, where the residents are is much lower gradient. Effectively, they are hemmed-in and with increasing rain events and an unmanaged stormwater outlet they are in increasing danger to their health and properties.

Given the importance and value of the wetlands I had taken the liberty of seeking the advice of Mr Rob Cross, the Kapiti-Wellington officer for the QEII National Trust. He noted that he needs to secure the permission of his national office first but was kind enough to offer an initial guidance noting the complexity and the need for an ecological assessment on the flow of the Stream and

Sean, at your suggestion, I touched base with Al Cross at GWRC, and last Wednesday evening we had a very constructive conversation about the Ngarara Stream situation, and it's impact on the serious Peka Peka flooding.

Whilst recognising the complex nature of activity consenting in that area, Al pointed out that there was some room for manoeuvre in an emergency situation, such that a suitably scaled action plan would receive serious consideration.

On Friday of last week, Mayor Guru sent an E-Mail to the GWRC Executive, stressing the urgency of the flooding which impacts 60+ households in the Peka Peka area - and where he used the "emergency" word in respect of that ...

... and on Tuesday, the GW Chief Executive responded to the Mayor, confirming that KCDC had the right to complete emergency clearance work, as long as future and longer-term activities in respect of the drain was folded into the agreed consent process.

From the Kawakahia group's point of view, the stream needs to be cleared from where the Black Drain's drainage channel joins it, then southwards to the Golf Course. As the stream is blocked extensively throughout that length, any clearance less than that would severely impact any chance of reducing the flooding north of the Pharazyn Ponds.

Also, I think the plan needs to reconfirm that the clearance method to be used is a digger with movable pontoons, addressing only the clogging vegetation, so that the stream structure is minimally impacted.

Sean, from my understanding about what was said late last week, an action plan along these lines has already been developed.

Can you please confirm that the urgency advised by the Mayor and accepted by the GW Executive, has already resulted in that plan being submitted to Al's team ?

Paul, I thought I'd come back to you quickly, following our discussion this morning, and the subsequent call I placed with Al Cross ... as a couple of useful clarification points have emerged.

Firstly, the immediate plan you are working on to clear the remainder of vegetative blocking in the Ngarara Stream, does not need to be shared with GWRC. Al is firmly of the opinion that this falls within the emergency powers provision, and is entirely for KCDC to develop and apply, in completing the urgent tasks at hand.

Secondly, an action plan covering a longer term view of remedial and/or maintenance activities in and around the Ngarara Stream, does need to be shared with GWRC. At this stage it's more important that the substantive components are presented, so that consenting-related discussions can get underway - but preparation of that should not get in the way of the immediate actions required for stream clearance.

Thirdly, and just to reiterate this, KCDC's ability to institute and complete the envisaged urgent clearance of this modified waterway, can be fully completed under the emergency powers provisions ... which Al is sure allows KCDC to circumvent the normal consenting process (for that scope of work only), to complete the clearance activities in the shortest time possible.

I am pleased to respond to your email regarding the flood hazard at [REDACTED] [REDACTED]

I have attached a plan of the property showing the flood hazard areas. There is a large flood storage area (green) on the property.

We recommend that you avoid building or earthworks within the storage area as this can displace flood waters into other areas. If you do propose to build within the storage area you will need to show that this would not increase flood hazard on the property or on other properties.

The 1% AEP (Annual Exceedance Probability) flood level for this part of the property is 4.1 m, given in terms metres above Mean Sea Level Wellington 1953 Datum. We recommend that any development is built above that level.

We recommend that you contact Kāpiti Coast District Council (KCDC) about any building controls or rules under their District Plan which apply to these hazards.

Where land on which building work is to be carried out is subject to, or likely to be subject to, flood hazard if KCDC grants a building consent under Section 72 of the Building Act 2004 they shall include a notation on the Certificate of Title. It is KCDC's responsibility to notify the owner if there will be a registration. We suggest that you discuss this with them directly.

In summary, GWRC Flood Protection recommends:

- That as a minimum you build to above the 1% AEP flood level of 4.1 m
- That you avoid development within the storage area
- That you contact KCDC about any building controls or rules under their District Plan which apply to these hazards
- That the property owner notify their insurer of this flood risk

Note that for construction to a given flood level, the level is to the underside of the floor joists or to the base of the concrete floor slab.





Thanks very much for sending this across Paul,

In the first place you are correct that the Harakeke Wetland is recognised as a significant natural wetland in the PNRP. The area of 'channel' that you marked on that last map looks like it would be within the 'significant natural wetland' mapped by GW. This means that any works within the wetland will need to be considered against rules R109 or R110 of the PNRP. Also of importance to consider is section 54 of the NES Freshwater see here <https://www.legislation.govt.nz/regulation/public/2020/0174/latest/LMS364282.html>.

These are some pretty serious considerations for whether works in this space will be able to be carried out. If you have any more specific details of what is proposed or photos of the area where you think vegetation could occur please send this across.



Subject: A Reversal ... and a Disaster in the Making

Yesterday, we attended a meeting with the Stormwater team at the Council offices, fully expecting it to be collegiate in nature, and looking forward to completion of critical drain clearance work, which had been described in writing only two days previously.

Instead, we were left bereft in the office vacated by the team, as we saw the promised deliveries from only 48 hours earlier, go up in smoke.

I now have to reverse the positive message I was able to provide to our Kawakahia Community Group members in that same timeframe, who've been with us in the journey of the last several months.

I have to explain why they now have to endure repeated flood events through the upcoming Winter and Spring months, with absolutely no assurances that anything further will be done to avoid further disasters to their properties - and their way of life.

I have to explain why a course of action which would mitigate, and potentially reverse extensive and financially damaging flooding of their properties, is no longer happening in the next few weeks (as promised) ... and is at best now not going to happen for the best part of six months (!), and potentially ruled out entirely !

Mayor Guru, you asked in a previous E-Mail, that we keep you informed of progress. Well here it is. Nothing.

In our area of interest, and sitting on top of multiple properties in Peka Peka, is a vast body of water ... which at a conservative estimate is **450,000 cubic metres** (or **450million litres**) in size.

This was caused when drainage in the area was reversed (due to lack of maintenance for over 25 years), and basically backfilled into that area.

During the December rain event of last year, that water level was even higher, and was lapping into the Pharazyn ponds.

If drainage efficiency is not recovered immediately - which is imminently possible based on earlier feedback from your Stormwater team, other significant weather events in the coming months will cause the water body to expand again.

It will reach new tipping points, and inundate other areas spared so far.

Effectively, the water will move the only way it can. South down the inland channel to engulf the Waikanae Golf Course, and further South to affect roads and properties in Waikanae.

And let's not forget that flooding encountered by residents and ratepayers to date, has submerged multiple septic tank installations. These are not the newer sealed units, but ones where (now) untreated effluent has entered and continues to spread throughout the surface water affecting the region in question.

These critical health and safety concerns are compounded for those those residents who have animals on the property - domestic and grazing, and by virtually every member of our 60+ households who have suffered land damage, plus plant and mature tree kill-off, costing many thousands of dollars to remove and/or replace them throughout the settlement.

Your team has indicated that the halt in the clearance activities is caused by eco-related constraints applied by the Greater Wellington Regional Council.

We and your team believe, that a middle ground can be found here, which reverses the flooding,

yet does not damage the eco aspirations of council(s) and residents alike.

After a lengthy discussion during the meeting on Friday, we repeated our previous offer (from March) to host representatives from KCDC and GWRC on some of the properties lying under the inland water mass.

In fact we insisted that your Council arrange an urgent meeting with a suitably authorised and informed member of GWRC, who has the ability to see the bigger picture here, and agree to progress a sensible route forward.

We look forward to an invitation to a combined Kawakahia, KCDC, and GWRC session next week, to get this done.



Hi Paul,

Thanks for your email.

The decision to undertake works under section 330 of the RMA is the responsibility of the person, authority or operator and we do not “grant permission” for emergency works. You may be able to undertake the works under s330 of the Act however there is a very high threshold for this. In order to meet this threshold you must be able to conclusively answer yes (with explanation) to all four questions below;

- Is there an adverse effect on the environment?
- Is the adverse effect affecting, or likely to affect a public work, natural/physical resource/area or network/lifeline utility operation?
- Does the adverse effect require immediate preventive or remedial measures?
- Is the work to be undertaken by a TA, GWRC, or a network/lifeline utility operator (or on their behalf under their expressed instruction)

Please see the full provisions of s330 here

<https://www.legislation.govt.nz/act/public/1991/0069/latest/DLM239003.html> .Please note that [section 330](#) is reserved for **immediate solutions/remediation** to an emergency, not necessarily a long term solution to an existing environmental hazard.

If you do choose to proceed with carrying out emergency works then you need to do the minimum amount of works needed to prevent ‘the emergency’, and should not go above or beyond this scope. If there are any alternative measures that are reasonably available and which do not amount to a breach of the RMA, or which would involve less environmental impact, they should be taken. These judgements must be made objectively and reasonably, if you decide to take action under s330 you will need to notify GWRC within 7 days and I suggest that you should document the rationale and decision making process for any actions taken.

I recognise the tricky situation you are in with the flooding. I think it is in KCDC’s best interests to get a legal opinion on if the proposed works would comply with s330 of the RMA. Please note that if works are carried out without resource consent (that are not a permitted activity) that GWRC do not consider to meet the legal tests of s330 of the RMA, we may investigate these as a breach of the RMA. If you have additional details of what the proposed works include that would be helpful to know.

I suggest that you write up a scope for the works proposed and provide an assessment under the

PNRP and NES Freshwater, based on the initial advice provided in my previous email. I will have a chat internally with our Flood Protection Department about this site and see what advice or extra considerations they have.




has been providing information to Paul Busing about various non-complying activities that need to be met namely:

1. R54 of the Resource Management (NESF) Regulations.

Within the 50 member Peka Peka group, questions have been asked about whether a resource consent was issued to allow the wetland to expand, and that damming, diverting and discharging water within 100 m of a wetland stated in R54(c) (because of a lack of maintenance) is a non-complying activity which has caused all these problems in the first instance but has been overlooked.

2. The other rule that Nick quoted is Rule R110 of the proposed Natural Resourced Plan. I can't find any draft of it and from what I can see this plan is not operational because it's going through an appeal process, so I don't understand how this can be referred to. From what I can see it's the regional plan that is the operational plan. Is this correct? Within it there are sections that are highly relevant to the situation in Peka Peka namely:

Disna/Sean, we need to set a date for the meeting with a suitably senior GWRC representative, given that we're all seeking their pragmatic approval to resume the clearance of the Ngarara Stream - at least from the Black Drain and Ngarara Stream convergence, down to the Waikanae Golf Course.

The urgency of this continues to be of critical importance to peoples' livelihoods, health and safety, and mental wellbeing.

I've just received an E-Mail from Paul Busing, where he's forwarded the latest response from GWRC, regarding their position, and the fact they can't meet with us this week.

Of the date options Paul mentions, the week beginning 28 July is far too late, and we really need it to happen as early as possible in the week beginning 18 July. I understand that Jocelyn is going to be away at conference later that week, so ideally we need to organise the session on Monday or Tuesday (18th or 19th July).

As you know, their representative needs to be senior enough to quickly authorise stream-clearance even if it means retrospectively issuing a consent, if one is in fact needed ... and also familiar enough with this part of their portfolio, that they understand the big picture, and that a middle ground is both being sought, and is possible.

The stated requirement for a GWRC resource consent being necessary, is in direct contrast to that provided by [REDACTED] when he meet with us on 1 July at the Pharazyn Reserve. He stated that no resource consent was required from GWRC, when vegetation only was to be removed from the Ngarara Stream in the vicinity of the wetland area.

An apparent paradox in respect of this stuff, is that a resource consent is required to extend a wetland because of any unplanned negative effects. It is my understanding that no resource consent or consents have been issued to permit the wetland areas to the north and south of the Pharazyn Reserve to be extended. Could you confirm if this is correct please ?

As I understand it, you are keen to identify a suitable window for the resumption and completion of this work. This must be completed by the end of August, if we are not to be stopped in our tracks by the season of fish migration and spawning.

Assuming 16 days is required to complete the work (based on the Goodmans estimate), that work must commence no later than 10 August.

We are keen to know what KCDC staff are doing as background work to expedite this process, and whether our group can help in any way.

For your further information, please be aware that we met with the party who raised some concerns about the nature of the clearance recently completed to the drain adjacent to the Black Swamp.

While they had concerns about how some of that vegetation was removed, they are in full agreement that the balance of the Ngarara Stream clearance should go ahead ... and quickly.

They also reaffirmed our view that any undue delay will see further inundation and damage south of the Pharazyn Ponds, should the pond's banks be overwhelmed by the remaining Winter and Spring rain events. An outcome which is highly likely.

Although the Black Drain has recently been cleaned out, water levels near Peka Peka Road have risen by 4 cm. If you work out the area of just that inundated land alone, that is a massive amount of water.

Please get back to us as soon as possible, and we will make ourselves available to meet with the GWRC folks - whether at your office, or (more desirably) on one of the affected properties.

I have to explain why they now have to endure repeated flood events through the upcoming Winter and Spring months, with absolutely no assurances that anything further will be done to avoid further disasters to their properties - and their way of life.

I have to explain why a course of action which would mitigate, and potentially reverse extensive and financially damaging flooding of their properties, is no longer happening in the next few weeks (as promised) ... and is at best now not going to happen for the best part of six months (!), and potentially ruled out entirely !

Mayor Guru, you asked in a previous E-Mail, that we keep you informed of progress. Well here it is. Nothing.

In our area of interest, and sitting on top of multiple properties in Peka Peka, is a vast body of water ... which at a conservative estimate is **450,000 cubic metres** (or **450million litres**) in size.

This was caused when drainage in the area was reversed (due to lack of maintenance for over 25 years), and basically backfilled into that area.

During the December rain event of last year, that water level was even higher, and was lapping into the Pharazyn ponds.

If drainage efficiency is not recovered immediately - which is imminently possible based on earlier feedback from your Stormwater team, other significant weather events in the coming months will cause the water body to expand again.

It will reach new tipping points, and inundate other areas spared so far.

Effectively, the water will move the only way it can. South down the inland channel to engulf the Waikanae Golf Course, and further South to affect roads and properties in Waikanae.

And let's not forget that flooding encountered by residents and ratepayers to date, has submerged multiple septic tank installations. These are not the newer sealed units, but ones where (now) untreated effluent has entered and continues to spread throughout the surface water affecting the region in question.

These critical health and safety concerns are compounded for those those residents who have animals on the property - domestic and grazing, and by virtually every member of our 60+ households who have suffered land damage, plus plant and mature tree kill-off, costing many thousands of dollars to remove and/or replace them throughout the settlement.

Your team has indicated that the halt in the clearance activities is caused by eco-related constraints applied by the Greater Wellington Regional Council.

We and your team believe, that a middle ground can be found here, which reverses the flooding, yet does not damage the eco aspirations of council(s) and residents alike.

After a lengthy discussion during the meeting on Friday, we repeated our previous offer (from March) to host representatives from KCDC and GWRC on on some of the properties lying under the inland water mass.

In fact we insisted that your Council arrange an urgent meeting with a suitably authorised and informed member of GWRC, who has the ability to see the bigger picture here, and agree to progress a sensible route forward.

We look forward to an invitation to a combined Kawakahia, KCDC, and GWRC session next week, to get this done.



Thanks for your time on the phone yesterday. I'm unable to attend a site visit this week, I suggest organising something for the week of the 18th once Josh and Jude are back.

As Josh has already indicated, the proposed activity is likely to be a non-complying activity under Regulation R54 of the NES-FM and Rule R110 of the PNRP. As it is non-complying, the activity is generally not anticipated by the plan (or NES) and a number of matters will need to be

considered before we can advise on whether it can be consented.

I have also noted that the area of work you have highlighted is listed in Schedule C of the PNRP (Sites of significance to Te Ātiawa ki Whakarongotai), it is therefore likely that Te Ātiawa ki Whakarongotai would be considered an affected party to any application within this area.

Yesterday, we attended a meeting with the Stormwater team at the Council offices, fully expecting it to be collegiate in nature, and looking forward to completion of critical drain clearance work, which had been described in writing only two days previously.

Instead, we were left bereft in the office vacated by the team, as we saw the promised deliveries from only 48 hours earlier, go up in smoke.

I now have to reverse the positive message I was able to provide to our Kawakahia Community Group members in that same timeframe, who've been with us in the journey of the last several months.

I have to explain why they now have to endure repeated flood events through the upcoming Winter and Spring months, with absolutely no assurances that anything further will be done to avoid further disasters to their properties - and their way of life.

I have to explain why a course of action which would mitigate, and potentially reverse extensive and financially damaging flooding of their properties, is no longer happening in the next few weeks (as promised) ... and is at best now not going to happen for the best part of six months (!), and potentially ruled out entirely !

Mayor Guru, you asked in a previous E-Mail, that we keep you informed of progress. Well here it is. Nothing.

In our area of interest, and sitting on top of multiple properties in Peka Peka, is a vast body of water ... which at a conservative estimate is **450,000 cubic metres** (or **450million litres**) in size.

This was caused when drainage in the area was reversed (due to lack of maintenance for over 25 years), and basically backfilled into that area.

During the December rain event of last year, that water level was even higher, and was lapping into the Pharazyn ponds.

If drainage efficiency is not recovered immediately - which is imminently possible based on earlier feedback from your Stormwater team, other significant weather events in the coming months will cause the water body to expand again.

It will reach new tipping points, and inundate other areas spared so far.

Effectively, the water will move the only way it can. South down the inland channel to engulf the Waikanae Golf Course, and further South to affect roads and properties in Waikanae.

And let's not forget that flooding encountered by residents and ratepayers to date, has submerged multiple septic tank installations. These are not the newer sealed units, but ones where (now) untreated effluent has entered and continues to spread throughout the surface water affecting the region in question.

These critical health and safety concerns are compounded for those those residents who have animals on the property - domestic and grazing, and by virtually every member of our 60+ households who have suffered land damage, plus plant and mature tree kill-off, costing many thousands of dollars to remove and/or replace them throughout the settlement.

Your team has indicated that the halt in the clearance activities is caused by eco-related constraints applied by the Greater Wellington Regional Council.

We and your team believe, that a middle ground can be found here, which reverses the flooding, yet does not damage the eco aspirations of council(s) and residents alike.

After a lengthy discussion during the meeting on Friday, we repeated our previous offer (from March) to host representatives from KCDC and GWRC on on some of the properties lying under the inland water mass.

In fact we insisted that your Council arrange an urgent meeting with a suitably authorised and informed member of GWRC, who has the ability to see the bigger picture here, and agree to progress a sensible route forward.

We look forward to an invitation to a combined Kawakahia, KCDC, and GWRC session next week, to get this done.



If you are going to consider advancing the s330 option please make sure that you consider that the provisions shall not apply to any activity undertaken to remove the cause of, or mitigate any actual or likely adverse effect of, the emergency. There needs to be an adverse effect on the environment or a sudden event causing or likely to cause loss of life, injury, or serious damage to property which requires immediate preventive measures. As previously mentioned I suggest that you get an RMA Lawyer to review this for you.

I think that KCDC is best positioned for meeting with the community group. I understand that the flooding is having an adverse effect on these properties. However, until a proposal is developed I do not think there is much I can add beyond the advice I have given. If a proposal and assessment against statutory requirements is produced we will be able to give further detailed advice and a site visit might be appropriate at that stage.

Thanks for your email.

The decision to undertake works under section 330 of the RMA is the responsibility of the person, authority or operator and we do not “grant permission” for emergency works. You may be able to undertake the works under s330 of the Act however there is a very high threshold for this. In order to meet this threshold you must be able to conclusively answer yes (with explanation) to all four questions below;

- Is there an adverse effect on the environment?
- Is the adverse effect affecting, or likely to affect a public work, natural/physical resource/area or network/lifeline utility operation?
- Does the adverse effect require immediate preventive or remedial measures?
- Is the work to be undertaken by a TA, GWRC, or a network/lifeline utility operator (or on their behalf under their expressed instruction)

Please see the full provisions of s330 here

<https://www.legislation.govt.nz/act/public/1991/0069/latest/DLM239003.html>. Please note that **section 330** is reserved for **immediate solutions/remediation** to an emergency, not necessarily a long term solution to an existing environmental hazard.

If you do choose to proceed with carrying out emergency works then you need to do the minimum amount of works needed to prevent ‘the emergency’, and should not go above or beyond this scope. If there are any alternative measures that are reasonably available and which do not amount to a breach of the RMA, or which would involve less environmental impact, they should be taken. These judgements must be made objectively and reasonably, if you decide to take action under s330 you will need to notify GWRC within 7 days and I suggest that you should document the rationale and decision making process for any actions taken.

I recognise the tricky situation you are in with the flooding. I think it is in KCDC’s best interests to get a legal opinion on if the proposed works would comply with s330 of the RMA. Please note that if works are carried out without resource consent (that are not a permitted activity) that

GWRC do not consider to meet the legal tests of s330 of the RMA, we may investigate these as a breach of the RMA. If you have additional details of what the proposed works include that would be helpful to know.

I suggest that you write up a scope for the works proposed and provide an assessment under the PNRP and NES Freshwater, based on the initial advice provided in my previous email. I will have a chat internally with our Flood Protection Department about this site and see what advice or extra considerations they have.

Specific issues that need discussion


1. Both KCDC [sewer] and First Gas [natural gas] are network utility operators and have concerns around their infrastructure..
2. Likelihood of flooding affecting, or likely to affect the sewer/gasline resulting in an adverse environmental effect or sudden event causing or likely to cause loss of life, or serious damage to property that requires immediate action.
3. If an emergency clearance of the ngarara stream through the wetland results in an adverse effect that continues, and therefore requires retrospective consent.
4. If a retrospective consent is deemed to be required, it will be extremely difficult to put a complete application together within 20 working days following the clearance. Therefore what would GWRC's expectation be in this area.
5. If GWRC have concerns around the use of S330 RMA do they have any suggestions as a way forward.

has been providing information to Paul Busing about various non-complying activities that need to be met namely:

1. R54 of the Resource Management (NESF) Regulations.

Within the 50 member Peka Peka group, questions have been asked about whether a resource consent was issued to allow the wetland to expand, and that damming, diverting and discharging water within 100 m of a wetland stated in R54(c) (because of a lack of maintenance) is a non-complying activity which has caused all these problems in the first instance but has been overlooked.

2. The other rule that Nick quoted is Rule R110 of the proposed Natural Resourced Plan. I can't find any draft of it and from what I can see this plan is not operational because it's going through an appeal process, so I don't understand how this can be referred to. From what I can see it's the regional plan that is the operational plan. Is this correct? Within it there are sections that are highly relevant to the situation in Peka Peka namely:

Disna/Sean, we need to set a date for the meeting with a suitably senior GWRC representative, given that we're all seeking their pragmatic approval to resume the clearance of the Ngarara Stream - at least from the Black Drain and Ngarara Stream convergence, down to the Waikanae Golf Course.

The urgency of this continues to be of critical importance to peoples' livelihoods, health and safety, and mental wellbeing.

I've just received an E-Mail from Paul Busing, where he's forwarded the latest response from GWRC, regarding their position, and the fact they can't meet with us this week.

Of the date options Paul mentions, the week beginning 28 July is far too late, and we really need it to happen as early as possible in the week beginning 18 July. I understand that Jocelyn is going to be away at conference later that week, so ideally we need to organise the session on Monday or Tuesday (18th or 19th July).

As you know, their representative needs to be senior enough to quickly authorise stream-clearance even if it means retrospectively issuing a consent, if one is in fact needed ... and also familiar enough with this part of their portfolio, that they understand the big picture, and that a middle ground is both being sought, and is possible.

The stated requirement for a GWRC resource consent being necessary, is in direct contrast to that provided by [REDACTED] when he met with us on 1 July at the Pharazyn Reserve. He stated that no resource consent was required from GWRC, when vegetation only was to be removed from the Ngarara Stream in the vicinity of the wetland area.

An apparent paradox in respect of this stuff, is that a resource consent is required to extend a wetland because of any unplanned negative effects. It is my understanding that no resource consent or consents have been issued to permit the wetland areas to the north and south of the Pharazyn Reserve to be extended. Could you confirm if this is correct please ?

As I understand it, you are keen to identify a suitable window for the resumption and completion of this work. This must be completed by the end of August, if we are not to be stopped in our tracks by the season of fish migration and spawning.

Assuming 16 days is required to complete the work (based on the Goodmans estimate), that work must commence no later than 10 August.

We are keen to know what KCDC staff are doing as background work to expedite this process, and whether our group can help in any way.

For your further information, please be aware that we met with the party who raised some concerns about the nature of the clearance recently completed to the drain adjacent to the Black Swamp.

While they had concerns about how some of that vegetation was removed, they are in full agreement that the balance of the Ngarara Stream clearance should go ahead ... and quickly.

They also reaffirmed our view that any undue delay will see further inundation and damage south of the Pharazyn Ponds, should the pond's banks be overwhelmed by the remaining Winter and Spring rain events. An outcome which is highly likely.

Although the Black Drain has recently been cleaned out, water levels near Peka Peka Road have risen by 4 cm. If you work out the area of just that inundated land alone, that is a massive amount of water.

Please get back to us as soon as possible, and we will make ourselves available to meet with the GWRC folks - whether at your office, or (more desirably) on one of the affected properties.

As discussed on Friday, Jocelyn is keeping Penny Taylor abreast of these matters, and seeking her help for further contact within GWRC, as appropriate.

On 9/07/2022, at 7:49 AM, [REDACTED] wrote:

Yesterday, we attended a meeting with the Stormwater team at the Council offices, fully expecting it to be collegiate in nature, and looking forward to completion of critical drain clearance work, which had been described in writing only two days previously.

Instead, we were left bereft in the office vacated by the team, as we saw the promised deliveries from only 48 hours earlier, go up in smoke.

I now have to reverse the positive message I was able to provide to our Kawakahia Community Group members in that same timeframe, who've been with us in the journey of the last several months.

I have to explain why they now have to endure repeated flood events through the upcoming Winter and Spring months, with absolutely no assurances that anything further will be done to avoid further disasters to their properties - and their way of life.

I have to explain why a course of action which would mitigate, and potentially reverse extensive and financially damaging flooding of their properties, is no longer happening in the next few weeks (as promised) ... and is at best now not going to happen for the best part of six months (!), and potentially ruled out entirely !

Mayor Guru, you asked in a previous E-Mail, that we keep you informed of progress. Well here it is. Nothing.

In our area of interest, and sitting on top of multiple properties in Peka Peka, is a vast body of water ... which at a conservative estimate is **450,000 cubic metres** (or **450million litres**) in size.

This was caused when drainage in the area was reversed (due to lack of maintenance for over 25 years), and basically backfilled into that area.

During the December rain event of last year, that water level was even higher, and was lapping into the Pharazyn ponds.

If drainage efficiency is not recovered immediately - which is imminently possible based on earlier feedback from your Stormwater team, other significant weather events in the coming months will cause the water body to expand again.

It will reach new tipping points, and inundate other areas spared so far.

Effectively, the water will move the only way it can. South down the inland channel to engulf the Waikanae Golf Course, and further South to affect roads and properties in Waikanae.

And let's not forget that flooding encountered by residents and ratepayers to date, has submerged multiple septic tank installations. These are not the newer sealed units, but ones where (now) untreated effluent has entered and continues to spread throughout the surface water affecting the region in question.

These critical health and safety concerns are compounded for those those residents who have animals on the property - domestic and grazing, and by virtually every member of our 60+ households who have suffered land damage, plus plant and mature tree kill-off, costing many thousands of dollars to remove and/or replace them throughout the settlement.

Your team has indicated that the halt in the clearance activities is caused by eco-related constraints applied by the Greater Wellington Regional Council.

We and your team believe, that a middle ground can be found here, which reverses the flooding, yet does not damage the eco aspirations of council(s) and residents

alike.

After a lengthy discussion during the meeting on Friday, we repeated our previous offer (from March) to host representatives from KCDC and GWRC on some of the properties lying under the inland water mass.

In fact we insisted that your Council arrange an urgent meeting with a suitably authorised and informed member of GWRC, who has the ability to see the bigger picture here, and agree to progress a sensible route forward.

We look forward to an invitation to a combined Kawakahia, KCDC, and GWRC session next week, to get this done.

Drivers for Action

- **Health and Safety Concerns** - including residents' elevated stress levels, and concerns about submerged septic tanks
- **Land and Property Damage** - including the death of hundreds of Mature Trees and shrubs (incl. Natives)
- **Infrastructure Dangers** - including FirstGas Pipeline submerged for more than 1 Kilometre
- **Habitat Damage** for pre-flood animals and birds - including rotting land ... and (ironically) submerged wetland we all want to prosper
- **Reducing Property Valuations** - as repeat Flood Reports negatively impact sales (albeit with no mention of "Flood Zone" on LIMs)
- **Reduced Grazing Income** - as the current flooding covers previous areas of pasture
- **Repeated Service Requests** from the Primary Landowner and other Residents/Ratepayers
- **The Paetawa Drainage Agreement** - binding KCDC to maintain drainage in the area, incl. the Ngarara Stream
- **Deeper/Wider Flooding and Inundation** - due to Recurring and more frequent Severe Weather Events and Rainfall

What's Stopping Us ?

- **KCDC Cancelled Contracted work on the Ngarara Stream** - following late advice (or consent application) to GWRC, and their response
- **GWRC Feedback from Wellington** suggests that the planned clearance activities need consent (at best), and may never receive consent approval - due to constraints in the Resource Management Regulations
- **GWRC Feedback from the Coast** suggests that work on private land does not require consent
- In 2019 **GWRC flagged the wetland** on the Landowner's property as a "significant natural wetland" in the (Proposed) Natural Resources Plan
- **The GWRC Position(s)** seem to focus on the waterway being either "natural" or "highly modified", and whether it crosses multiple properties, and/or crosses a wetland

The Kawakahia View

“Our sole objective is to clear a clogged waterway drain, to reduce and mitigate against harmful and dangerous flooding, both now and in the future”

- Action is required now, to safeguard the health of residents, protect key infrastructure and properties, and mitigate against even greater flooding from future serious weather events - of which there will be many
- The Ngarara Stream is a highly modified waterway, peripheral to the wetland in question - and the remainder of the work already started, does not cross multiple property boundaries
- The stream lies within the property of the landowner of the wetland, who's requested KCDC to clear unwanted vegetation, under terms of an existing Agreement (the Paetawa Drainage Agreement), which precedes other policy or regulation documents
- The extent of the work is limited to the removal of blocking vegetation, with no planned silt removal
- We believe our approach is “middle ground” in nature - neither physically damaging the adjacent wetland, nor the intentions of the QE11 Covenant on the title of that land - and is in the spirit of current and emerging policy (including Three Waters)

has been providing information to Paul Busing about various non-complying activities that need to be met namely:

1. R54 of the Resource Management (NESF) Regulations.

Within the 50 member Peka Peka group, questions have been asked about whether a resource consent was issued to allow the wetland to expand, and that damming, diverting and discharging water within 100 m of a wetland stated in R54(c) (because of a lack of maintenance) is a non-complying activity which has caused all these problems in the first instance but has been overlooked.

2. The other rule that Nick quoted is Rule R110 of the proposed Natural Resourced Plan. I can't find any draft of it and from what I can see this plan is not operational because it's going through an appeal process, so I don't understand how this can be referred to. From what I can see it's the regional plan that is the operational plan. Is this correct? Within it there are sections that are highly relevant to the situation in Peka Peka namely:

Disna/Sean, we need to set a date for the meeting with a suitably senior GWRC

representative, given that we're all seeking their pragmatic approval to resume the clearance of the Ngarara Stream - at least from the Black Drain and Ngarara Stream convergence, down to the Waikanae Golf Course.

The urgency of this continues to be of critical importance to peoples' livelihoods, health and safety, and mental wellbeing.

I've just received an E-Mail from Paul Busing, where he's forwarded the latest response from GWRC, regarding their position, and the fact they can't meet with us this week.

Of the date options Paul mentions, the week beginning 28 July is far too late, and we really need it to happen as early as possible in the week beginning 18 July. I understand that Jocelyn is going to be away at conference later that week, so ideally we need to organise the session on Monday or Tuesday (18th or 19th July).

As you know, their representative needs to be senior enough to quickly authorise stream-clearance even if it means retrospectively issuing a consent, if one is in fact needed ... and also familiar enough with this part of their portfolio, that they understand the big picture, and that a middle ground is both being sought, and is possible.

The stated requirement for a GWRC resource consent being necessary, is in direct contrast to that provided by [REDACTED] when he met with us on 1 July at the Pharazyn Reserve. He stated that no resource consent was required from GWRC, when vegetation only was to be removed from the Ngarara Stream in the vicinity of the wetland area.

An apparent paradox in respect of this stuff, is that a resource consent is required to extend a wetland because of any unplanned negative effects. It is my understanding that no resource consent or consents have been issued to permit the wetland areas to the north and south of the Pharazyn Reserve to be extended. Could you confirm if this is correct please ?

As I understand it, you are keen to identify a suitable window for the resumption and completion of this work. This must be completed by the end of August, if we are not to be stopped in our tracks by the season of fish migration and spawning.

Assuming 16 days is required to complete the work (based on the Goodmans estimate), that work must commence no later than 10 August.

We are keen to know what KCDC staff are doing as background work to expedite this process, and whether our group can help in any way.

For your further information, please be aware that we met with the party who raised some concerns about the nature of the clearance recently completed to the drain adjacent to the Black Swamp.

While they had concerns about how some of that vegetation was removed, they are in full agreement that the balance of the Ngarara Stream clearance should go ahead ... and quickly.

They also reaffirmed our view that any undue delay will see further inundation and damage

south of the Pharazyn Ponds, should the pond's banks be overwhelmed by the remaining Winter and Spring rain events. An outcome which is highly likely.

Although the Black Drain has recently been cleaned out, water levels near Peka Peka Road have risen by 4 cm. If you work out the area of just that inundated land alone, that is a massive amount of water.

Please get back to us as soon as possible, and we will make ourselves available to meet with the GWRC folks - whether at your office, or (more desirably) on one of the affected properties.

Yesterday, we attended a meeting with the Stormwater team at the Council offices, fully expecting it to be collegiate in nature, and looking forward to completion of critical drain clearance work, which had been described in writing only two days previously.

Instead, we were left bereft in the office vacated by the team, as we saw the promised deliveries from only 48 hours earlier, go up in smoke.

I now have to reverse the positive message I was able to provide to our Kawakahia Community Group members in that same timeframe, who've been with us in the journey of the last several months.

I have to explain why they now have to endure repeated flood events through the upcoming Winter and Spring months, with absolutely no assurances that anything further will be done to avoid further disasters to their properties - and their way of life.

I have to explain why a course of action which would mitigate, and potentially reverse extensive and financially damaging flooding of their properties, is no longer happening in the next few weeks (as promised) ... and is at best now not going to happen for the best part of six months (!), and potentially ruled out entirely !

Mayor Guru, you asked in a previous E-Mail, that we keep you informed of progress. Well here it is. Nothing.

In our area of interest, and sitting on top of multiple properties in Peka Peka, is a vast body of water ... which at a conservative estimate is **450,000 cubic metres** (or **450million litres**) in size.

This was caused when drainage in the area was reversed (due to lack of maintenance for over 25 years), and basically backfilled into that area.

During the December rain event of last year, that water level was even higher, and was lapping into the Pharazyn ponds.

If drainage efficiency is not recovered immediately - which is imminently possible based on earlier feedback from your Stormwater team, other significant weather events in the coming months will cause the water body to expand again.

It will reach new tipping points, and inundate other areas spared so far.

Effectively, the water will move the only way it can. South down the inland channel to engulf the Waikanae Golf Course, and further South to affect roads and properties in Waikanae.

And let's not forget that flooding encountered by residents and ratepayers to date, has submerged multiple septic tank installations. These are not the newer sealed units, but ones where (now) untreated effluent has entered and continues to spread throughout the surface water affecting the region in question.

These critical health and safety concerns are compounded for those those residents who have animals on the property - domestic and grazing, and by virtually every member of our 60+ households who have suffered land damage, plus plant and mature tree kill-off, costing many thousands of dollars to remove and/or replace them throughout the settlement.

Your team has indicated that the halt in the clearance activities is caused by eco-related constraints applied by the Greater Wellington Regional Council.

We and your team believe, that a middle ground can be found here, which reverses the flooding, yet does not damage the eco aspirations of council(s) and residents alike.

After a lengthy discussion during the meeting on Friday, we repeated our previous offer (from March) to host representatives from KCDC and GWRC on on some of the properties lying under the inland water mass.

In fact we insisted that your Council arrange an urgent meeting with a suitably authorised and informed member of GWRC, who has the ability to see the bigger picture here, and agree to progress a sensible route forward.

We look forward to an invitation to a combined Kawakahia, KCDC, and GWRC session next week, to get this done.

Namesti & Kia Ora Daran and Nigel,

I'm writing this as a matter of urgency to bring to your attention the plight of just over 60 residents living along Waikanae's Paetawa Rd in proximity to the Pharazyn Ponds, the Te Harakeke Wetlands and the Ngarara Stream. Having read their concerns and completed a site visit on 19th July I am concerned for their health and safety as well as the potential impact on their property values. While this is my immediate concern, I am also looking at this as a back-to-the-future type case where this problem of rising groundwater levels today is a harbinger of what's going to rapidly unfold soon to our communities because of climate change.

In going back to the immediate concerns I'm particularly aware that a number of these lifestyle properties are dependent on on-site septic tanks under stress from rising groundwater levels thus increasing health risk. I'm also aware that a gas pipeline, owned by FirstGas, that's routed through this area has some 1 kilometre of its pipe submerged and therefore, I assume, there is a potential danger to this infrastructure. I understand that following appeals from residents my council had initiated contracting work to resume our stormwater maintenance obligations associated with the Ngarara Stream. But this had come to an abrupt stop given GWRC's responsibilities under its Natural Resources Plan and its associated need to secure a consent with a caveat that even if an application is made there is no guarantee a consent would be granted. I further understand that the area of concern includes the Te Harakeke Wetlands with its significance underpinned by a QE II National Trust Covenant.

I think it's clear that the situation is a complex one, and the residents are fully cognisant of this, but in taking small bites of this elephant, the immediate danger to the residents needs to be addressed and my council can invoke its powers under emergency requirements to take immediate remedial actions and applying for a retrospective consent for the works. But I also understand the reluctance of my staff to invoke this when there is a possibility that in doing so a retrospective consent may be rejected leaving council in an invidious position. I'm not aware of such a situation to have the benefits of a case study. Given this, I have taken the unusual step of securing the pro bono advisory services of barrister [REDACTED] to help the local residents navigate through this complexity. I am grateful to [REDACTED] for his perception that what we are witnessing unravelling here is the precursor of potential legal challenges caused by the impact of climate change on coastal communities. I refer you to the observations made by [REDACTED] QC in a paper to a Local Government NZ conference "Who's afraid of creative judges" where he warns that a policy gap in managing climate change impacts will result in expensive legal challenges in court and resulting in the defacto outcomes where the courts end up making climate change policies via case law. We know this is already happening.

On that note, I have taken the liberty to alert Mr Jim Bolger, the Chair of our Coastal Advisory Panel looking at coastal adaptation, on what is happening to this coastal community along Paetawa Rd. Consultants providing expert evidence to this panel have noted that the coastal beach front along this stretch is accreting. My understanding is that the land beyond the beach front, where the residents are is much lower gradient. Effectively, they are hemmed-in and with increasing rain events and an unmanaged stormwater outlet they are in increasing danger to their health and properties.

Given the importance and value of the wetlands I had taken the liberty of seeking the advice of Mr Rob Cross, the Kapiti-Wellington officer for the QEII National Trust. He noted that he needs to secure the permission of his national office first but was kind enough to offer an initial guidance noting the complexity and the need for an ecological assessment on the flow of the Stream and its effects on the ecology of the wetland including its hydrology and whether changes affect its return to the natural state, and whether any 'clearance' would affect the Stream and wetland. It's useful to note that the governments Climate Change Adaptation Plan includes a template on risk assessment providing for the balance between a range of values including economic and environmental values but the experts providing technical evidence and advice to the panel chaired by Mr Bolger's are unlikely to present this compendium of measured risks in time to help our current problem. Mr Cross' observations also means additional time lapse. I'm bringing this to your attention to alert you to the wider issues dovetailing into this immediate and justified concerns of the Paetawa Rd residents.

In my culture we have what Māori term a whakataukī...a proverb. "How do you fit an elephant into a pot?" We need the urgent clearance for KCDC to do the immediate work necessary and the ability to seek a retrospective consent through a process that recognises the climate change adaptation issues. It's also important for all parties involved in this case to work collaboratively and be seen publicly to be doing that to educate our communities on the challenges we face from climate changes and the way to secure community solutions. And not having to go through legal challenges. I appreciate your officers have started their communications directly with the residents and I look forward to your response.

Both Penny and I have linked with the chair of the residents group last week.

I've also connected with Sean Mallon (KCDC Infrastructure Services GM) – our respective teams have begun to work this through.

A few key points in summary

- **Context** Highly complex situation. Stream clogged with veg and running through wetlands. Wetlands concerned are scheduled in the PNRP (ecological values and mana whenua significance) and covered by national regs. Navigating this is fairly tricky but not impossible. On the advice of Shaun and his team I firmly believe there is a way through it.
- **KCDC approach** KCDC is planning for both emergency works and possible longer term regular maintenance works.
- **Emergency works** I've discussed with Sean. KCDC are enabled to undertake emergency works as a network utility provider. This will be their decision to take but I did advise Sean to seek advice to make sure their approach is safe and sound legally. Limited works therefore could probably be undertaken in the short term but unlikely to cover the full KCDC/residents gamut of interest / opportunity. Retrospective consenting (following actual emergency works) also quite possible and if this does come to pass my team would work positively and constructively with KCDC to work this through.
- **Consenting time-frames** Retrospective consenting and particularly longer term global maintenance consenting will likely take months rather than weeks to work through.
- **GWRC operational interests** Flood Protection interests downstream on the Waimeha Stream. GWRC primarily undertake the maintenance work on the Waimeha Stream at the mouth (coastal section) and then the Waimeha stream above the confluence with the Ngarara Stream. The area that are of concern at this stage are those bits on the Ngarara Stream above the confluence with the Waimeha.
- **Next regulatory steps** Alongside emergency works considerations. Sits with Sean Mallon and his team to draw up a set of possible options to bring to our team; possibly followed by a conversation with residents.
