### Activities this report covers

This report covers compliance monitoring for the all coastal works and activities for the previous year up to 30 June 2017. Coastal works and activities include a wide range of activities e.g. sand extraction, beach renourishment, boatsheds, and swing moorings.

### What we've done

This year we monitored 42 consents for coastal works and activities:

### What we've noticed

The level of compliance has improved in the 2016/2017 year and we have seen an overall increase in the number of coastal activities undertaken.

### What we'd like to fix or change

Throughout the Wellington region there are a number of areas of boatsheds which have common consent expiry dates. This means that in 2018, over 100 boatsheds will be due to apply for renewal of coastal occupation consents. In order to assist with managing this process, GWRC is looking to undertake a targeted compliance monitoring programme for boatsheds in the coming year.
